The SEBD Doctoral Scholars Program was started in 1989 with tunds from The Pew Charitable Trusts and the Ford Foundation. It is part of a nationwide initiative, the Compact for Faculty Diversity, to increase the number of minority persons with doctorates and to encourage them to seek faculty positions.





# **UK** should place more emphasis on student safety

A few incidents in UK's dorms last spring have once again brought

dorm safety to the forefront of many people's minds.

A deadly accident occurred at Kirwan Tower finals week. Jeffrey Pfetzer, a UK freshman, and Matthew Rzepka, a Western Kentucky University student, were wrestling in the third floor lobby of the dorm. The two fell out of a plate glass window and died.

out of a plate glass window and died.

Toxicology reports are not yet available to determine the blood alcohol levels of the students. However, some say that the fatal fall could have been prevented if UK had installed a special kind of safety glass. Federal building codes mandated the use of this glass, much like the safety glass used in car windshields, in 1973. This did not affect Blanding Tower, which was built in 1962.

Back in February, a fire on the 13th floor of Blanding Tower prompted a two-hour evacuation of the dorm. No students were injured, but the fire resulted in burned bulletin boards and dorm decorations and scorched

resuited in ourned bulletin boards and dorm decorations and scorched carpeting.

Blanding Tower is equipped with sprinklers; however, the sprinklers were not activated during the fire. In a previous interview with the Kernel, UK Fire Marshal Garry Beach said the fire burned itself out and the sprinklers were not needed.

According to Beach, Kirwan I, II, III and IV are the only dorms on

According to Beach, Kirwan I, II, III and IV are the only dorms on campus without sprinkler systems. At the time of the interview, installation of sprinklers was set to begin within a few months.

Two incidents in one semester are two incidents too many. Student safety must be a top priority at UK. Financial constraints have been cited as a major deterrent for the installation of new safety glass and sprinkler systems. These improvements will cost millions of dollars. Then again, what is the price of a human life? UK alumni and donors are willing to donate millions to build new buildings and renovate sports fields. Surely a fundraising campaign focusing on saving lives and improving dorm safety could be successfully executed. It's worth a try.
