DUPPA, RICHARD, a barrister, and as a literary character remarkable for the versatility of his talents, was educated at Trinity College, Oxford, and took the degree of LL.B. at Cambridge, in 1814. He wrote many interesting works, among which are "The Life and Works of Michael Angelo Buonarrotti," "The Life of Raffaele," "Travels in Italy," &c. Died, 1831.
