I have just received a letter from my brother T. J. Borrow from which it appears he has had leave of absence from the Col the Earl of Orford up to the present year. He says in a letter dated Wolverton 21st June 1826 his Lordship thus writes no blame is to be attached

Sir if you should require it I will forward this last letter which my brother has sent to me. I hope now from that you will have no further objection to issue an order for the payment of the portion of my brothers arrears appearing on the two affidavits in the possession of the General. ~~I am compelled to state that my brothers arrears have been debarred-~~ I should ~~not be-~~ by the unnecessary obstacles which have been flung in my brothers way in obtaining his arrears he has been subjected to great inconvenience and distress. A speedy answer on this subject will much oblige
