

At Mrs. Dickson's  
Phila., Feb. 5, 1876

My dear Mrs Martin

I reached here this  
last evening, and found Mrs  
Wood waiting for us with Mr  
Dickson; all were soon filled with  
each other's happy faces & cheery  
words as soon as we reached Mr  
Dickson's house.

I am to leave this for New  
York on Monday, & shall remain  
over night with A. A. Low in Brooklyn  
where I am to make an address  
at the L. I. Historical Society, on  
Tuesday. But I shall have time  
to go over to New York and see you

on Tuesday forenoon or later. If you can remain at Mr Dodge's part of the day, I can doubtless get there by noon or earlier. If anything prevents carrying out this arrangement, you can let me know at Mr Low's (3 Burling Slip) on Tuesday early (or on Monday will be better) If I do not hear I will regard this plan as agreeable to you, & get up to Mr Dodge's by noon on Tuesday

Mr Dickson & cousin Harriet are looking forward to your visit here with great anticipation; & so do I to see you once more
