CARR, Sir John, a writer of travels, was born in Devonshire 1772, and practised as an attorney in the Middle Temple, London. He received the honour of knighthood from the lord-lieutenant of Ireland about 1805, and died 17 July, 1832. He published 'Fury of Discord,' a poem; Stranger in France;' 'Tour from Devonshire to Paris; 'The Sea-side Hero,' a drama; 'A Northern Summer, or Travels round the Baltic, through Denmark, Sweden, Russia, part of Poland, and Prussia;' 'The Stranger in Ireland,' which gave rise to an excellent jeu d'esprit, entitled, Pocket Book,' by Edward Dubois; 'Caledonian Sketches;' 'Descriptive Travels in the Southern and Eastern parts of Spain and the Balearic Isles;' and a volume of Poems.
