MITFORD, John, was born at Richmond, Surrey, 13 Aug., 1781, and educated at Tunbridge School, and Oriel College, Oxford. He obtained the living of Benhall, Suffolk, 1810. In 1815 he was appointed domestic chaplain to his relative Lord Redesdale, and presented to the rectory of Weston St. Peter's; and in 1817 to that of Stratford St. Andrew, both in Suffolk. He died at Benhall 27 April, 1856. This accomplished scholar was for many years editor of the 'Gentleman's Magazine,' and the principal writer in it from 1834-50. He also wrote some poetical works, and edited Grey, Spenser, Milton, Dryden, Butler, Prior, Swift, Young, Parnell, Goldsmith, Falconer, and Vincent Bourne.
