**DOYLE, Sir Arthur Conan**, Kt., *cr.* 1902; novelist; was Senior Physician of the Langman Field Hospital, South Africa; *b.* Edinburgh, 22 May 1859; *e. s.* of Charles Doyle, artist; *n.* of Richard Doyle of Punch; *g. s.* of John Doyle [famous as H.B. the caricaturist]. *Educ.*: Stonyhurst; Edinburgh University. Practised as doctor at Southsea, 1882-90; travelled Arctic Regions, West Coast of Africa, etc. M.D. (Edin.); contested Central Edinburgh (L.U.), 1900. *Publications*: A Study in Scarlet, 1887; Micah Clarke, 1888; The Captain of the Polestar, 1888; The Sign of Four, 1889; The White Company, 1890; The Firm of Girdlestone, 1890; Adventures of Sherlock Holmes, 1891; The Refugees, 1891; The Great Shadow, 1892; The Memoirs of Sherlock Holmes, 1893; Round the Red Lamp, 1894; The Stark Munro Letters, 1895; The Exploits of Brigadier Gerard, 1896; Rodney Stone, 1896; Uncle Bernac, 1897; The Tragedy of the Korosko, 1898; Songs of Action, 1898; A Duet with an Occasional Chorus, 1899; Halves (a play), 1899; The Green Flag and Other Stories, 1900; The Great Boer War, 1900; Cause and Conduct of the War, an attempt to place the true facts before the peoples of Europe (100,000 copies given away); The Hound of the Baskervilles, 1902; Adventures of Gerard, 1903; Return of Sherlock Homes, 1904. *Recreations*: golf, cricket, cycling. *Address*: Hindhead, Surrey. *Clubs*: Athenæum, Reform, Authors', National Sporting, M.C.C. 62. 354. 6
