St. Boniface, Manitoba, since 1885; Rector of the ecclesiastical province of the ecclesiastical province comprising the archdiocese of St. Boniface, the dioceses of St. Albert (Alberta), Regina, and the three vicariates of Saskatchewan, Athabaska, Mackenzie, and Yukon; *b.* St. Isidore, La Prairie, Quebec, Canada, 23 Aug. 1855; *s.* Théophile Langevin, a near relative of Hector Langevin, late Minister of Finance in Ottawa, and Pamela Racicot, daughter of Monsignor Racicot, Vicar-General of the diocese of Montreal. *Educ.:* M. A. Studied theology at the St. Boniface Seminary, Montreal; completed the course of his theology (moral) at St. Boniface (Jesuits), Montreal; entered the Society of Oblates of Mary Immaculate, 1878; priest, 1882; preacher for diocese 1882-85; Professor of Moral Theology at the Catholic University of Ottawa, where he became Vice-Dean of the Theology Department, 1885; D.D. 1892; went to Manitoba of the Oblates in the Archdiocese of St. Boniface, and Rector of St. Mary's, Winnipeg, 1893; has visited England, France, Belgium, Germany, in 1890; Rome, Italy, as Father thrice, in 1896, 1898, and 1900; same year visited the Holy Land; has interest of the Catholic school system; has founded 28 parishes, 24 missions, 3 hospitals, 1 orphanage, 1 boarding-schools; has double missions among the Indians; *publications:* has issued 14 pastoral circular letters. *Address:* Archbishop's Office, St. Boniface, Manitoba, Canada.
