SIR RICHARD BROWNE Bart. was born in 1605, and his grandfather
Sir Rich. Browne was employed under the celebrated Earl of Leicester in his
government of the Netherlands. He received his education at Merton Coll.
Oxford, and in 1646, we find him Resident at the Court of France; for on
the 27th of June in the same year, his daughter Mary, to whom the above
letter is addressed, became the wife of John Evelyn at Paris. In 1673 he
was Master of the Trinity House, and died of the gout & dropsy, 12th of
Feb. 1683, aged 77 in his own mansion, says Court, Deptford, in which his
son in law subsequently resided. Agreeably to his own request, he was buried
in Deptford Church yard, under the S.E. window of the Chancel.
