The pleasure I enjoyed in your company when dining with your Brother and yourself in London gives me boldness in my present communication.

I am prevented from going to Ireland by providential necessity - that of being back in my Divorce time to meet my Convention previously to the Session of the State Legislature this coming fall and winter. If I miss that, whole year will be lost - and such prostration will be the almost ruin to our Cause. The public pulse now beats high in my nation
