Now Amos Dear

My dear Sir,

The change
of time in holding the "asso-
ciation" will deprive me
of the pleasure of attending
it. This I regret exceedingly.

With that I rec'd a letter
to President Fessenden, in rela-
tion to a matter which I
have very much at heart.

In my late Sanson week,
I announced in the most ex-
plicit manner, that while
I had any thing to do with
this institution, no vicious
student should ever be

receive a degree from
me. This is the point,
I want to bring before
the Association, & hope, if
not ready to act upon it,
they will at least name
a Committee to which
the subject may be refer-
red. Please read my letter
to Mr. Tappan, & as far as
you feel ready to do so,
promote my plan in re-
lation to the whole matter.
I send you, for him & for
the Association, a parcel
of the Reports & Resolutions,
adopted at Columbus,
last year. Make such
use of them as you see fit.

I hope you will have
a good meeting. Please
send me any report of
its proceedings which may
be published in your pa-
per or elsewhere, &
wth much oblig^s;
