

CLARKE, JAMES STANIER, LL.D., having graduated at Cambridge, was for some years chaplain in the navy, and was in that capacity with Nelson, at the battle of Trafalgar. On being introduced to Geo. III., the king was pleased with him, and he became chaplain and librarian at Carlton House. He wrote numerous publications which bear his name, and was the founder of the Naval Chronicle. Died, at Brighton, 1834.
