Dear Sir,

I hasten to reply to your note of this day respecting the Ladies' diary, and in answer to your questions beg to state that

D^r Hutton compiled it to 1819 when he resigned the Editorship of the Company's Almanack, D^r Gregory succeeded him as Editor and conducted the Diary to 1840 when he resigned, and it was then placed with the other Almanacks in the hands of M^r W. S. B. Woolhouse (Actuary of the National Loan Fund, Life and Annuity Office, Cornhill) in 1841 the gentleman's diary was united with it and the title of the work is now "The Ladies and Gentleman's Diary" - M^r Leybourn compiled the Gentleman's diary till he died which was in 1840 - there is nothing further at all interesting respecting the diaries that I can furnish you with.

I was directed at the last meeting of our Board to send a bound Vol. of the Company's Book Almanacks, with one of the Stationers Sheet Almanack in a frame for the use of the British Museum, which shall be sent to you in a day or two.
