DEATH OF MR. ALEXANDER CHRISTIE, A. R. S. A.

—Mr. Alexander Christie died at his house in Darnaway-street, Edinburgh, on Sunday morning. His extremely delicate state of health for several months past (says the *Scotsman*), culminating in a serious illness of some weeks' duration, had prepared his more intimate friends for the event which has terminated in middle life the career of a very estimable man and deserving artist. Mr. Christie long held the position of one of the masters of the School of Art, under the Board of Trustees for Manufactures in Scotland, and was considered a very successful teacher. He had considerable ability, originality, and taste in design, and was a bold and effective colourist. He has exhibited one or more pictures in every exhibition of the Royal Scottish Academy for many years.
