

Goodall, Edward (b. 1795, d. 1870), English engraver, abandoned painting on being commissioned by Turner to engrave his pictures; and also made plates for *The South Coasts*, Rogers's *Italy*, and the *Literary Souvenir*.

Goodall, Frederick (b. 1822), English painter; son of preceding; won the silver medal of the Society of Arts when little more than a boy; exhibited *Card Players* at the Academy at the age of seventeen; was elected A.R.A. in 1853, and R.A. in 1863. Previously to this his chief pictures had been *The Tired Soldier* and the *Village Holiday* (in the National Gallery), and some historical paintings. He travelled much for the purpose of his studies, both in Europe and Egypt. Among his more recent pictures may be named *The Song of the Nubian Slave*, *Hagar and Ishmael* (1866), *A Litter of Doves*, and *A Fruit Woman of Cairo* (1875); *Glencoe* (1877), *Palm Sunday* (1878), *Holy Childhood* (1880), *Crossing the Desert* and *Water for the Camp* (1883), *Gordon's Last Messenger* (1885), *Leading the Flock* (1889), and *The Thames from Windsor Castle* (1890).

The obituary of the 27th ult. mentions the departure of Mr. Edward Goodall, engraver, famous for his reproductions of Turner's middle and later styles, especially 'Caligula's Bridge,' 'Cologne,' and 'Tivoli,' also for Roger's 'Italy,' and 'Poems,' with Turner's 'Southern Coast,' and an immense number of small works. Mr. Goodall was a native of Leeds, died at 76 years of age, and was the father of Mr. F. Goodall, R.A. *An error* 52v.1
