I. SIR JOHN-FRANCIS DAVIS, K.C.B., D.C.L. Oxford; F.R.S.; late Her Majesty's Plenipotentiary in China, and Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Hong Kong; *b.* 16 July, 1795; created a baronet 18 July, 1845; *m.* 1st, in 1822, Emily, dau. of Lieut.-Col. Humfrays, of the Bengal Engineers, and by her (who *d.* 7 Sept. 1866) had,

He *m.* 2ndly, 26 Nov. 1867, Lucy-Ellen, eldest dau. of the Rev. T.-J. Roche, vicar of Exmouth, and had a son,

II. FRANCIS-BOILEAU, present bart.

Sir John Davis was attaché to Lord Amherst's embassy to Peking in 1816, and was joint-commissioner with Lord Napier in China, 1834. He *d.* 13 Nov. 1890.

Creation—18 July, 1845. *Arms*—Arg., a chevron, nebuly, between three mullets in chief, another in base, pierced, sa. *Crest*—Two Indian pikes in saltier, ppr., surmounted by a mullet, pierced, sa., between two wings, vair, arg. and sa. *Motto*—Utili secernere honestum. *Seat*—Hollywood Tower, Westbury-on-Trym, Gloucestershire. 6042
