The swimming pool will formally open on May 15, and we have decided to offer to EMPLOYEES ONLY the right to purchase season tickets at a reduced price.

The regular price of admission to those who do not hold season tickets will be 25 cents for adults and 15 cents for children plus Federal and State taxes.

The pool will be open from May 15 to September 15, inclusive (four months). The cost of season tickets for married men will be \$6.00 collected at the rate of \$1.50 each month or 75 cents each half month. The purchase of a season ticket will entitle the employee, his wife and all members of his family to admission to the pool without limit during the entire season; and season tickets will be issued to the employee as well as to each member of his family. The State and Federal tax in the event of a family season ticket must be paid by the employee; and this tax, as nearly as we can calculate now, will amount to 60 cents to the Federal Government and 30 cents to the State Government.

Single employees would be permitted to buy season tickets at the rate of \$4.00 for the season or \$1 per month, which would be collected at the rate of 50 cents each half month. The season ticket will permit the holder to be admitted to the pool throughout the season without limit. The State and Federal tax, which will be in addition to the cost of the season ticket will amount to 40 cents to the Federal Government and 22 cents to the State Government.

I am attaching hereto a form which should be signed by all employees who desire to purchase season tickets. Sufficient copies of the form are enclosed for distribution to each section foreman, and I am sending to each department head who is receiving a copy of this letter enough forms for his use in soliciting employees in his department.
