

It seems to me the trouble you have experienced with the blocking of the main line sewers in the past, and more particularly this week, makes it necessary to carry through to early completion the following program of work:

1. The sewer lines should be cleared of the obstructions that presently exist.
2. A letter should be sent to each tenant instructing him as to the proper use of the house plumbing. I will send out that letter, but I first want an outline of your views on the context of the letter.
3. You should take immediate steps to work out a plan so that the holes in the manhole covers can be closed in such a manner that children and others cannot place stones, sticks, et cetera in the sewer. Several suggestions were made as to how that can be done at the conference in my office today.

You should assign some men to the completion of the work mentioned in paragraph No. 3 at once, and I would like to have your views on the letter to all tenants within the next several days.
