Zimmerman The Water Pollution Control Commission of Kentucky has recently established a regulation which requires that the executive office of the Commission be notified whenever it is planned or necessary to discharge industrial waste into streams. This regulation also requires that the executive office be notified in advance if any concern plans to discharge waste into a stream. This regulation has now been made a part of the Ken-tucky Revised Statutes and we are, therefore, required to comply with it. I will not go into detail as a copy of the regulation is attached, and this speaks for itself. It is sufficient to state that if, for any reason, waste material from the cleaning plant or from any of our mines is discharged to a stream, a telegram should be sent to the executive office of the Water Pollution Control Commission, the address of which is 620 South Third Street, Louisville, Kentucky.
