



JULIAN M. CARROLL

Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

JULIAN MORTON CARROLL became Kentucky's 58th governor on December 28, 1974, succeeding Wendell H. Ford, who was elected to the U. S. Senate. Carroll then won a full four-year term in the 1975 general election. Born in McCracken County in 1931, he attended Paducah Junior College after graduating from Heath High School. He was graduated from the University of Kentucky in 1954 and received his law degree from UK in 1956. Before becoming governor, Carroll served three years as lieutenant governor and ten years as a member of the Kentucky House of Representatives. He is an active member of the Optimist Club and a former Jaycee. He attained the highest office in Kentucky for laymen of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in 1966-77 when he was named moderator of the Kentucky Synod. The Governor and his wife, Charlann, have four children.

H. FOSTER PETTIT

Mayor Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government

H. FOSTER PETTIT served two years as mayor of the City of Lexington and was a leader in the consolidation of the city and county governments. He was elected mayor of the Urban County Government in November 1973.

President of the Kentucky Municipal League for 1976, Mayor Pettit is also active with the U. S. Conference of Mayors and the National League of Cities. He was awarded the Optimist Cup in 1976 and the Chamber of Commerce Citizen-of-the-year citation for 1975.

As chief executive of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, the mayor is authorized to supervise, administer and control all departments of government.


The mayor is elected on a non-partisan basis every four years. He is responsible for the proper administration of all services of the government. He is assisted principally by the Chief Administrative Officer and commissioners of the six departments.

A native of Lexington, he is an attorney who served three terms as a state representative. He resides on Richmond Road with his wife, Marion, and four sons.

Dr. Otis A. Singletary University of Kentucky President



Now in his ninth year as president of the University of Kentucky, DR. OTIS A. SINGLETARY is a Mississippian whose route to the Bluegrass State curled through Louisiana, Texas, North Carolina and Washington, D. C.

He came to Lexington from a position as University of Texas vice-chancellor for academic affairs. Previously, in Washington, he had been director of the U. S. Job Corps in the early stages of its development before moving to the American Council on Education as vice-president. He had gone to the capital in 1964 after three years as chancellor of the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.

The UNC appointment terminated Dr. Singletary's first association with the University of Texas, this a seven-year stay that saw him, as a young historian, rise rapidly in rank from instructor to full professor and begin the shift to administrative work, first as associate dean and later as assistant to the president.

The Kentucky president, and his wife—the former Gloria Walton, met when both were students at Millsaps College. He later earned master's and doctoral degrees at Louisiana State. The Singletarys have two daughters, Bonnie and Kendall, and a son, Scott.

Cliff Hagan Director of Athletics

"I've been preparing for this all my life," CLIFF HAGAN said before taking over as athletics director at the University of Kentucky in 1975. Hagan succeeded Harry Lancaster as director after serving as assistant director for three years.

Hagan's path to the athletics directorship began in Owensboro, Kentucky, where he established a then state high school tournament record of 41 points in leading Owensboro to victory over Lafayette in the championship game of the 1949 state high school tournament.

At UK, he played on teams that won 86 of 91 games and an NCAA championship (1951). The 1954 team, undefeated in 25 games, elected not to participate in the national tournament.



FRANK HAM **Assistant Director** of Athletics

FRANK HAM became Assistant Director of Athletics in July 1975 soon after Cliff Hagan succeeded Harry C. Lancaster as Director of Athletics.

A native of Scranton, Pa., Ham came to the University in 1969 as Administrative Assistant to football coach John Ray, and was reassigned to the Athletic Director's staff in 1972 when Ray resigned.

Ham graduated from high school at Niles, Michigan, and completed his undergraduate work at Olivet College. He did graduate work at Indiana University and coached high school football and track at John Adams High in South Bend in 1944-46 and then returned to Olivet as athletic director and head football and basketball coach.

In 1962, he became assistant to the president at Olivet, with responsibilities in public and alumni relations. He was in private business from 1954 until 1968.

He is married to the former Rosemary Woods of Niles, Michigan. They have two sons, Michael, of Raleigh, N. C., and Craig, a U. S. Army Captain, and two daughters, Mrs. Andy Hunsberger of Cassopolis, Michigan and Jennifer, a senior at UK. Ham is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Albert B. Ham of Edwardsburg, Michigan.

LARRY IVY Assistant Director of Athletics For Finance

Adding a new dimension to UK athletics was the appointment last year of LARRY IVY as Assistant Director of Athletics for Finance.

Ivy, who came to the University as Director of Housing in 1969, is involved primarily with the administration and management of financial aspects, and develops and initiate policies for accounting procedures and related business management activities of the department.

A native of Alabama, Ivy graduated in 1961 from Huntsville High School, where he lettered in four sports. He is a 1967 graduate of the University of Alabama, and earned his M. B. A. from Alabama in 1968.

He is married to the former Barbara Foster of Huntsville. They have a daughter, Kim.

University of Kentucky Wildcats Head Basketball Coach

JOE B. HALL'S record as Wildcat head coach for the past five years stands at 105-40. Hall became No. 1 varsity assistant and head freshman coach to Adolph Rupp after Harry C. Lancaster was named permanent athletic director on February 1, 1969. His record with the freshmen was 60-15, including an undefeated (22-0) season (1971-72) which resulted in the Kittens being crowned National Freshman Champions by the Basketball News.

During his first season as head coach, the Wildcats won their last nine conference games to sew up the SEC title.

His eleven-year coaching record is 181-96. Broken down, it shows a 57-50 five year mark at Regis, a 19-6 record at Central Missouri, and a 105-40 five year record at Kentucky.

A popular personality on the clinic and convention circuits, Hall also has had much international exposure. In addition to the Globetrotters tour in 1951, and the "Down Under" tour in 1974, he has helped conduct basketball clinics for the U.S. Army in Anchorage and Fairbanks, Alaska (1968) and at Ramstein Air Base in Frankfurt, Germany and the RAF Base at Mildenhall, England in 1975. He also was Olympic Trials coach under Hank Iba at the Air Force Academy in July 1972 and was a member of the 1976 Olympic Basketball Committee.

Coaching Assistants

DICK PARSONS

DICK PARSONS, in his sixth year as Joe B. Hall's No. 1 assistant, returned to the University as baseball coach in 1969. Before giving up his position to join basketball on a full time basis, he molded a baseball team (1971) which established or tied 15 school records.

LEONARD HAMILTON

Much of Kentucky's defensive prowess on the court can be credited to the talent of LEONARD HAMILTON, a fourth year assistant, who came to UK after three years as an assistant at Austin Peay State University.

JOE DEAN, JR.

The newest addition to the Wildcat coaching staff is parttime assistant coach JOE DEAN, JR. Dean, who will be working primarily with the Wildcat guards, is a 1976 graduate of Mississippi State University where he played guard for the Bulldogs and then joined the coaching staff while completing requirements for a masters degree in physical education.











ROY DON WILSON

Trainer

Entering his eighth year at UK is Roy Don Wilson, who came to the University after serving two years as trainer at The Citadel. A native of Texas, he is a graduate of Amon Carter Riverside High School in Fort Worth. He received his B. S. degree from Texas A & M with a major in physical education and a minor in business. He is married to the former Patricia Jane Cotter of Houston. They have a son and a daughter.



WALT McCOMBS **Trainer**

Returning to UK last year after a three-year absence during which he served in a similar capacity at Clemson University is Walt McCombs. Assigned primarily to basketball, McCombs also works with Wilson on the football filed. A native of Belton, S. C., McCombs is a graduate of Parker High School and a 1971 graduate of The Citadel, where he was student trainer for four years. He was assistant trainer at UK in 1972 and '73. He is married to the former Shelby Burris of Belton.

PARKING

Reserved parking is available directly across from the Lexington Center. Ramping and curb cuts allow for an uninterrupted surface from the parking lot into the main building.

ELEVATORS

Elevators leading to the various Mall levels are available in the lobby of the Hyatt Regency Hotel. Elevators to the floor level of Rupp Arena are available with attendant service in the Purple Concourse at events in which floor seating is available.

HOTEL ROOMS

One room on every floor of the Hyatt Regency Hotel has been designed to be totally accessible for persons in wheelchairs

RESTROOMS

All public restrooms within the Hyatt Regency Hotel and the lower level of the Mall, as well as in Rupp Arena, are so designed as to accommodate wheelchairs.

TELEPHONES

At every bank of public telephones at least one phone has been lowered to within vertical reach of persons in wheelchairs.

SEATING

In Rupp Arena, a permanent area to accommodate 24 wheelchairs is reserved at the concourse level, at sections 22 and 23. Immediately in front of these wheelchair stations, a row of seats is reserved for a companion.

a row of seats is reserved for a companion.

Floor level seating for the handicapped may be available for certain events. Check with the ticket office to determine if those seats will be available for particular events. Ushers will escort you to the floor level via elevator and prior to the performance will instruct you on emergency procedures.

PURCHASE OF TICKETS

It is essential that you notify the ticket office at the time of purchase if you desire a wheelchair ticket, and if applicable, a ticket for your companion. This will insure you of a reserved space. Failure to do so may result in confusion and inconvenience to you at showtime. Since all events at Rupp Arena utilize reserved seating, wheelchairs may be placed only in those designated areas. You and your companion must occupy the space as indicated on your ticket.

UK School of Music Program To Be Televised

The University of Kentucky School of Music's annual Christmas program will be broadcast on a network of five television stations and the KET network this month

It will be the first time that the annual program, this year titled "A Gift of Music from the University of Kentucky," has been televised.

The program is being originated by Lexington station WLEX-TV which will air the program from 10 p.m. to 11 p.m. on Thursday, Dec. 15.

Other stations which will carry a half-hour version of the program on Christmas Day are WAVE-TV,

Louisville, 9:30 a.m.; WFIE-TV, Evansville, 9:30 a.m.; WPSD-TV, Paducah, tentatively scheduled for 4 p.m.; WSAZ-TV, Huntington, 1 p.m., and the Kentucky Educational Television (KET) network at 3:30 p.m. CST and 4:30 p.m. EST.

The concert will feature the UK Chorus (105 voices), the UK Choristers (47 voices), and the UK Chorale (17 voices) and a children's chorus from Lexington's Glendover elementary school.

The musical program is under the direction of Sara Holroyd of the UK School of Music, and the television program is co-produced by WLEX-TV and the UK Information Services Department.

'OLD BLUE'

IT'S THE WAY TO TOUR THE UK CAMPUS

Much more than a conversation piece, the University of Kentucky's English double-decker bus dubbed "Old Blue" has transported about 12,000 passengers since it took up residence at UK in the fall of 1974.

Old Blue is still a source of awe, however, for UK students who happen to pass its 14-foot high frame as the vehicle picks up a load of passengers for the Monday-through-Friday tour of the UK campus.

The bus, formerly part of the London omnibus fleet, has taken about 6,000 UK students, faculty, staff, alumni and visitors on the daily campus tours. Another 6,000 passengers have boarded the bus for special tours or conference transportation.

Old Blue was purchased by the UK Alumni Association and given to the University. It is painted the traditional UK blue and is the same bus that traveled the streets of London after it came off the assembly line 20 years ago.

Departing from beside the Administration Building each weekday at 2 p.m., Old Blue provides passengers with an overall view of the University, while a student tour guide explains various campus landmarks and the different uses of University facilities.



Kentucky Wins Over South Carolina 98-67 December 13, 1976

Jack Givens scored 28 points as the Wildcats gave South Carolina the worst defeat ever for South Carolina on the Gamecocks homecourt. The previous worst was seven points.

UK had all the ingredients for an excellent performance. It shot 61.1 per cent from the field, it outrebounded Carolina by 10, and once again it played tough, aggressive defense. After the Goose's 28 points, came Mike Phillips with 22 and Larry Johnson with 16.

From the start UK showed absolutely no respect for the winning tradition South Carolina has established in Carolina Coliseum (92-9) since moving into the arena in 1968.

UK took command early by hitting almost every shot against McGuire's 2-1-2 zone defense. With 12:26 left in the first half, UK led 25-9 after connecting on 12 of 16 shots.

At this point McGuire called time and switched to a manto-man. It didn't help much, but Carolina began to score a little better against UK's man-to-man.

UK finally hit one dead spot late in the half, going more than two minutes without a field goal. Carolina cut UK's lead from 43-25 to 43-32.

UK got a couple of quick steals and spurted out to a 20-point margin, 52-32, before Bill Gause hit a 25-footer to cut it to 18.

UK finished the first half, with 67.6 per cent shooting, 25 of 37. Carolina had 12 for 25 for 48.0. Givens was the deadliest UK shooter in the opening half with 20 points, hitting 10 of 14 field goal attempts.

UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH CAROLINA BASKETBALL OUTLOOK 1977-78

Coach Frank McGuire has four starters returning from last year's 14-12 team, which marked South Carolina's 11th consecutive winning basketball season.

The Gamecocks have five other returning lettermen plus four freshmen. The top two returnees are senior guard Jackie Gilloon—who already holds Gamecock records for most assists in a career, a season, and one game—and 6-9 sophomore Jimmy Graziano.

In addition to 117 assists last year, Gilloon averaged 9.7 points per game. Graziano averaged 13.2 points, second only to the 15.7 by departed forward Nate Davis, and led the team in rebounding with a 7.7 average as a freshman.

Other returning starters include 6-4 sophomore guard Mike Doyle, who averaged 8.9 points as a freshman; and 6-6 senior Karlton Hilton, a forward who scored at a 7.4 average. Golie Augustus, 6-5 senior, started some games and averaged six points per game, and 6-1 Bill Gause, who averaged 2.0, also started a few games.

Sophomores Kenny Reynolds, 6-2, and Mark Connaughton, 6-8, performed as reserves last year and could step in this season. Junior 6-5 forward Bryan Grevey underwent preseason knee surgery and his availability is questionable.

The freshmen include two 6-7 forwards—Rich Wejnert of Toms River, N. J., and Steve Harty of Forest Hills, N. Y.—and two guards, 6-2 Zam Fredrick of St. Matthews, S. C., and 6-0 Kevin Dunleavy of Brooklyn, N. Y.


Assessing the season's prospects realistically, McGuire said, "we are a young team and should be competitive. However, we need another big man up front and we could be a year away from being an outstanding team."

The big man shortage could be solved in 1978-79 by 6-8, 220 pound Cedrick Hordges of Montgomery, Ala., a transfer from Auburn. Under NCAA transfer rules, Hordges must sit out the 1977-78 season before becoming eligible to play for the Gamecocks.

Arena Information

FIRST AID

The University of Kentucky and the Lexington Center provide for your convenience and weltare, a First Aid Station on the Purple Concourse. Persons with any type of chronic medical problem are requested to leave their name and seat location with the nurse on duty at the First Aid Station. A person in need of assistance with a health emergency should report the situation immediately to an usher. Doctors on call and other individuals who might expect an emergency call are requested to leave their name and seat location at the will call window of the box office prior to entering Rupp Arena. In the event of an emergency, you will be notified at your seat. In order that the activities and program in Rupp Arena not be disrupted, paging over the public address system is not possible.

CARDIAC CARE

In cooperation with the University Medical Service, the University of Kentucky provides a cardiac resuscitation program at all UK basketball games.

LOST AND FOUND

Lost and found articles should be reported or turned in to an usher or a security officer. You may wish to write to the director of arena security and describe lost articles which will be returned if found.

NO HORNS

Horns are not permitted in Rupp Arena and will be picked up at the entrances. Be considerate and allow your neighbor to enjoy the game. Keep portable radios at a low volume.

GATE INFORMATION

Rupp Arena will normally open one hour prior to any scheduled event. Please do not leave the arena until the conclusion of an event or game or at halftime if you plan to re-enter. No "Pass-out" tickets will be issued and you will not be permitted to re-enter.

COURT REGULATIONS

Spectators must keep off the court at all times. Spectators must use the arena stairs and vomities. There are no public facilities located on the arena floor level. Public facilities in Rupp Arena are located on the entry concourse level. You will find all refreshment stands, drinking fountains, public telephones, restrooms, vending machines and first aid on the concourse level.

LIQUORS

Alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited within the arena as are all food and drink containers including hard surfaced materials of any type, bottles, cans, thermos bottles, ice bags, ice chest, and any object related to above. Arena personnel are instructed to enforce this rule in the interest of safety. PUBLIC ADDRESS

Messages for the public address announcer are acceptable only in emergencies and must be approved by the Sports Information Director at University of Kentucky basketball events.

SIGNS

Signs and barriers are restricted in Rupp Arena in accordance with policies established by arena management and public safety officials.


- All persons must have a ticket






