Jury finds Camara guilty for DUI

Losing two: Coach Felton resigns to scout for Pacers

The UK basketball team suffered two losses Tuesday with the verdict of Jules Camara's DUI offense coming out guilty and the resignation of associate head coach George

sociate head coach George Felton.

Tony Neely, the media relations director for the Athletics Department, said Felton's resignation had nothing to do with Cama-ra's verdict.

Camara, a junior forward, was found guilty

Tuesday in the Fayette District Court by a jury of five women and one man on charges of driving while under the influence on Sept. 3. Camara pleaded innocent to the charges. Under UK's zero tolerance alcohol policy, Neely said the guilty verdict means Camara will lose his basketball scholarship indefinitely.

The alcohol policy does not state when the termination of Camara's scholarship will go into effect.

Neely said it will be up

Neely said it will be up to the athletics adminis-tration to decide upon a

possible time of return for Camara in the future. Neely also said Camara would no longer be al-lowed to practice with the team or take part in any team activities.

UN chief appeals for Mideast talks

JERUSALEM — Amid scattered new outbreaks of violence in the West Bank and Gaza Strip, U.N. Secretary-General Koff Annan appealed Monday to Israel and the Palestinians to get back to the bargaining table and end the cycle of killing. Tuesday was a day of intense diplomatic activity, including talks with both Israelis and Palestinians by Annan, Russian Foreign Minister Igor Ivanov, and European Union security chief Javier Solana. Israeli Frime Minister Euda Barak also spoke Monday night with President Clinton and French President Jacques Chirac, the prime minister's office said.

Top U.S. official visits Belgrade

WASHING(TON — In a show of support for newly installed President Vojislav Kostunica, the Clinton administration will soon ropen the U.S. Embassy in Belgrade and also hopes to re-establish diplomatic relations with Yugeslavia. The State Department also announced Monday that James C. O'Brien, the senior U.S. Official for Balkans development, was flying to Belgrade to meet with Kostunica, a further reversal of the icy distance that marked Slobodan Milosevic's rule.

Bush qualified? — but when the lights go on Tuesday for their second debate, voters can look for both men to turn on the charm. Neither candidate wants to risk any further voter backlash by openly going on the attack, whatever their negative ads and quote-slinging surrogates are saying elsewhere.

CHICAGO — Birth control pills may raise the already heightened risk of breast cancer faced by women with a family history of the disease, a study suggests. Among sisters and daughters of women with breast cancer, users of the pill were three times more likely than nonusers to get the disease. If at least five family members had breast or ovarian cancer, pill users faced an 11-fold risk, the researchers report in today's edition of Journal of the American Medical Association.








The tobacco war: George W. Bush surrogates fear that a Gore administration could mean more taxation, legal attacks on tobacco

MIDWAY, Ky. — Republican presidential candidate George W. Bush was back in Texas cramming for his next debate. His surrogates were standing in front of William Mitchell's tobacco barn.

A gathering of many of Kontucky's GOP leading lights with the standing in the standi

ident Al Gore of conducting an eight-year holy war against to-bacco. McConnell dismissed the idea, put together by the White House and Kentucky Gov. Paul Patton, to form a panel to look into a buyout of tobacco quotas.

"It's been amusing to watch the governor trying to get Al Gore to say something on tobacco," McConnell said.

Other speakers were 6th district U.S. Rep. Ernie Fletcher, who is locked in his own election battle against Democrat Scotty Baesler, a former congressma; Jefferson County Judge-Executive Rebecca Jackson, whose own aspirations find her traveling across the state; Senate President David Williams of Burkesville; and

ary Bunning, the wife of U.S. en. Jim Bunning, who arrived Sen. Jim Bunning, who arrived late from attending a bridge dedication in Maysville.

McConnell warned that a
Gore administration would

attacks on tobacco. Bush, Mcconnell said, is against any taxes and does not plan to continue the quest to regulate the
nicotine in tobacco as a drug.

Gov. Paul Patton argued last week that a Gore victory would give him great sway on tobacco in a Democrat White House.

The two presidential campaigns, though, have approached Kentucky in dramatically different fashions.

Bush has visited Kentucky six times since he wrapped up the GOP nomination. Vice presidential candidate Dick Cheney has visited twice, not even counting his trip to Danville last week for the debate.

Al Gore has only been to Kentucky twice and, although Joseph Lieberman was in Richmond virtually all of last week, he did little real campaigning. "Gore certainly can win Kentucky, but they're going to have to put in more effort," Pat The Republican approach to tobacco has won at least one convert Paul Hornback, a farmer from Shelby County, said he changed registration to the GOP last year. "I don't think there's but one way to vote for tobacco farmers," Hornback said.

Just like it was a light bulb of a procedure for manufacturing a product.

The final, and perhaps scariest, perk of Gnutella is that it isn't limited just to music files — it encompasses all music files. 
Cats fall in polls


