The campaign features three advertisents. The first, "Commitment," focuses on UK faculty and students excelling in diverse fields of study. The second is titled "Lemonade" and describes UK's largest federal grant – \$22 million to improve math and science classes in schools in Appalachia. The third spot, called "Smile," describes UK's College of Dentistry outreach efforts, which have helped improve the oral health of more than 250,000 Kentuckians.

Blanton said all the subjects of the ads, such as the dental outreach program, were chosen to show the UK's role in public service.

The advertisements will cost around \$140,000. The television ads will run statewide for around four weeks and can be seen by a regional and national audience through UK's athletic contracts. 



BEIRUT, Lebanon — Thousands of on yesterday, setting fire to the Danish consultate, attacking a prominent Maronite Catholic church and smashing car and shop windows in protest of the publication of t

Christian cultures of the West, Sumi Islam forbids any artistic rendering of the prophets, including Jesus and Moses.

Denmark, which reportedly had evacuated its consular offices in Lebanon in anticipation of a Muslim backlash, urged its citizens to leave Lebanon.

Syrian protesters set fire to the Norwegian and Danish embassies in Damascus on Saturday.

"These are people who want to desta-blize the country," said tourism minister Joseph Sarkis, who drove through the Christian neighborhoods under armed guards to appeal for calm as the rlots qui-eted down. "They are receiving orders from the source we all know to provoke a clash between the communities."

California jail riot kills one, injures 50

appearance," Baca told reporters outside
the jail, which has a history of racial violence.

"It is a carry over, in our opinion, from what is a feud between gangs in the Los Angeles South Central area," Baca said. "And that will happen when you bring to jail people who want to continue whatever their war was on the street... It is essentially a brown-on-black incident today which led to the fighting that occurred in these dorms."

The disturbance involved part of the North County Correctional Facility, a sprawling 34-arce complex 40 miles north of downtown Los Angeles that includes five large jail buildings housing 4,000 inmates. Most the immates at the North County jail are awaiting trial or being transferred to or from state prison, Baca said.

Saturday's violence was the seventh major incident in the county jail system involving multiple inmates in the past two months, records show.

Alabama sophomore Terin Humphrey took home first place all-around honors with a score of 39,375 out of a possible 40 points. UK junior Krys-

tle Cook continued her success, placing second with a score of 39.125. Friday's match marked the fifth straight meet that Cook has finished in the top two overall

Ashley Miles and Brittany Magee paced the Tide with two 9.95 marks, followed by Humphrey with a 9.875.
"One of tonight's highlights was the spark in Terin Humphrey's performance," said Alabama head coach Sarah Patterson. "She overcame some difficulties she had in vault and upgraded her floor routine as well.
"I think she's starting to put the fun back into gymnastics again this season," she said.
Alabama returns to action Friday against No. I Georgia in what is expectthat Cook has finished in the top two overall.

Senior Lucy Burgin placed third with a season-high score of 38,425 for UK (7-1,1-1).

"Krystle is showing great signs of leadership in and out of the gym." Mohammad said. "We expect that from her as a junior and she is doing a great jobs as providing hat for the younger gits."



www.necipycocer.com of www.necipycocor.com of with a good drink. Perhaps you should consider an exceptional bottle of wine with dinner; better yet, a beverage that suits your theme. Even if you are just serving water, consider garnishing it with lime or lemon. Determining what kind of soup or salad to make is relatively easy. Either can complement any meal. I do not recommend taking the time to make these from scratch. Instead, buy a pre-packaged bag of Dole salad (which come in a number of varieties, such as Caesar, Garden and European) or a can of Campbell's soup (also comes in a

number of varieties, such as vegetable, tomato or clam chowder).
What to do for dessert is the next step. Chocolate-covered strawberries are a classic choice and very easy to make. (Melt choocolate in a sauce-pan, stirring constantly to avoid burning, carefully dip strawberries into chocolate and let dry on wax paper. Decorate by adding sprinkles.) Cheesecake is another idea and can be garnished with freshly cut strawberries, or something a little simpler like heart-shaped cookies. Whip up your favorite cookie mix (I recommend sugar cookies for this) use a heart-shaped cookie cutter to cut out dough and bake. To make things more festive, spread pink or red frosting on the tops of the cookies and garnish with sprinkles.
Once you have set the menu, gather your ingredients and buy what is necessary to make your dinner work. Do this a few days in advance.
On the day of, clean up the dining room. Add some magic to the dinner by lighting candles and spreading rose petals on the table. Use your best dishes and silverware, even if they are made of paper and plastic (hey, easier cleanupl). Gather some romantic music to play in the background. Excellent choices include Frank Sinatra, Norah Jones or Nat King Colo.

Place dough in an oiled bowl, cover, and let rise until doubled in size. Punch down and turn onto an oiled sheet pan. Stretch and push dough to the corners. Brush with olive oil and sprinkle with additional rosemary leaves and coarse salt. Let rest 10 minutes. Bake at 425 until golden (about 25 minutes).




