The increases reflect the CHE's attempt to put Kentucky's tuition rates in line with those of benchmark institutions — universities that are similar in size and scope. In setting the increase schedules for Kentucky's two doctoral institutions, the Council uses UK's 11 benchmarks and the University of Louisville's and the University of Louisville's CHE staff members compiled statistics on the per capita income of eight states around Kentucky that contain the benchmark institutions and the tuttion rates charged at the

various benchmarks, Walker said.
Then the staff computed the percentage of tuition rates to per capita income; the mean percentage was 12.
Walker said this system, which was used for the first time in 1981, is much more fair to students than the former method for setting tuition rates. Under the old system, ruttion rates. Under the old system, ruttion rates were set based on the mean trition at benchmark universities; the factor of per capita income in the state was not taken into account.

## House has bloc against MX despite reports, O'Neill says

WASHINGTON — Leading House Democrats said yes-terday there is a solid party bloc opposed to President Reagan's plan to build the MX missile, even though sources say the weapon has picked up support from a key Democratic committee chairman. House Speaker Thomas P. O'Neill, emerging from a meeting with the House leadership, said he has 200 Democratic votes against the weapon. O'Neill's comments came the day after House sources said House Armed Services Committee Chairman Les Aspin has agreed to vote for the weapon later this

month.

The Wisconsin Democrat was persuaded by arguments that killing the powerful, long-range nuclear missile just after U.S. Soviet arms control talks convene March 12 in Geneva would undermine the American negotiating position, the sources said.

His support for the I0-warbard weapon appears to be enough to ensure that the MX will clear the House by a small margin in a vote to be taken about March 25, small margin in a vote to be taken about March 25.

ama rights allegations are part of a "propaganda campaign" by the leftist Sandinista government.

The law group's report marked the second time this week that private U.S. human rights organizations have criticized the Nicaraguan rebel forces for human rights violations.

On Tuesday, the Americas Watch Committee, another Washington-based group, said all sides in Nicaragua's conflict have violated the laws of war, but that the Sandinista government has reduced its abuses while those of the contras have continued unchecked.
