### Congress must realize industry should clean-up their act

The Clean Air Act is up for reauthorization in Congress and thousands of lobbyists are working in Washington, some to fortify it and others to water it down. One important facet of the act regards acid precipitation and regulations for industries who emit poisons into the air.

Acid precipitation is not something to be shrugged off. It can kill fish and other aquatic life, eat away buildings and monuments, and threaten crops, forests and humans.

Industries that are responsible for vomiting sulfur dioxide and nitrogen oxides into the air are widening loopholes in the 1970 Clean Air Act by thrusting quarter-mile high smokestacks through them.

Since the pollutants are emitted into the atmosphere at such extraordinary heights, particles don't settle in the ground or in the air surrounding the plant. Instead they are carried hundreds of miles by air currents into the wild grey yonder, only to react with moisture and then precipitate to earth.

Once the particles become acid precipitation and deposit back upon the ground, the effects can be devastating. Fish die in massive numbers, lakes and ponds are strangled and marble and limestone buildings deteriorate. Repercussions on humans range from chronic bronchitis and asthma to death from cancer, not to mention acidic ground, rain and drinking water.

Offending industries are now lobbying in Washington against stricter clean air legislation. Unless there is extensive counter-

lobbying, chances are good that the utility and industrial monsters will win because they've got money, influence and James Watt on their side.

One gross problem with the Clean Air Act is that each state is expected to regulate itself. Because of this, what is an acceptable air quality level in one state is not acceptable in another.

"The Clean Air Act is really one of the chief reasons for the increase in acid rain," said Robert F. Flacke, commissioner of New York State's Department of Environmental Conservation. "Not only did its earlier policy bring about the long-range transport of air pollution via tall stacks, it also permits New York and other clean-plant states to be dirtied by states with looser air standards."

Scrubbers, machines that clean smokestacks, would greatly reduce the amount of soot and particles being thrust into the atmosphere. Industries are reluctant, however, to put in scrubbers because of excessive installation and maintenance costs.

Although some solutions have been implemented, they are only temporary. The liming of lakes and ponds acts only like a Rolaid by neutralizing acids. Building smokestacks higher only carries particles farther.

Not only should the Clean Air Act be reauthorized, but more stringent restrictions ought to be placed on industries that blatantly circumvent existing regulations. The price of our environment is too high a price to pay for their negligence.

Its share of state funding relative to other universities in the commonwealth has literally declined over the past ten years, and UK receives less real dollars than it did in 1971. As its needs have been ignored, outstanding professors have left, and today the state of Kentucky is last in the nation in terms of federal dollars granted for

## Nuclear waste debate moves into fast lane

The ailing nuclear industry interrupted its vigil outside a New York courtroom long enough to ask for aims from the federal government.

Federal Judge Abraham Sofaer is pondering the validity of a Department of Transportation rule requiring trucks carrying nuclear waste to travel over interstate highways. The rule, a legacy from Jimmy Carter, which supersedes local and state regulations, was to go into effect Feb. 1. Judge Sofaer ordered a 10-day stay. Executives of 15 utilities, who no longer exemplify the "magic of the marketplace" that Ronald Reagan preaches, proposed at a meeting with

research.

It is time for the governor and the General Assembly to make a decision: do we sincerely want UK to make a commitment to excellence? Do we want it to compete with other research universities around the nation for federal funds? Do we want high quality education in medicine, law, business, mining engineering and the other vital professions?

If we do, we must support the Council of Higher Education's "mission model" formula for funding higher education which stresses different roles for different universities in the state. We must seriously decide whether UK is going to be one of five regional universities or the flagship of the fleet.

I believe and my colleagues on the Prichard Committee believe that Kentucky has only one real alter-

native — to adequately support its flagship university. It's time to end the old approach of uncontrolled growth for all universities with the resulting duplication of programs. It's time to make some hard choices. The citizens of Fayette County should recognize the importance of this issue to the community and our state and lend their support to the proposed "mission model" formula and adequate funding for UK.

Vice President Bush allegedly told them he would get back to them. The matter of transporting nuclear wastes on federal highways, which is of enormous moment to the nuclear establishment, has been "under review" for a year.

It has generated protests from 220 localities; countless bills in state legislatures and Congress, public hearings of unparalleled storminess and a plethora of lawsuits, of which the state of New York is the most prominent.

Twelve senators, led by Charles H. Percy of Illinois and William Proxmire of Wisconsin, have written a letter demanding to know if this is the "new federalism" — Ronald Reagan's proposal of local supremacy — at work. It was addressed to Sen. Paul Laxalt of Nevada, chairman of the President's Task Force on Federalism.

Jimmy Carter, who demonstrated a certain ambivalence on nuclear issues as an others — he was a foe of proliferation, but a friend of nuclear power — ordered the Department of Transportation on his last day in office to ride over local objections and mandate the carrying of radioactive garbage over interstate highways. Some people think that radioactive

garbage is too dangerous to be carried anywhere and that reactor owners should be required to store it at the plant sites. The nuclear industry wants the federal government to share the expense and embarrassment. It says that if it cannot unload its leftovers to away-from-reactor storage sites and truck it to the federal burndowns, it may have to close down its reactors, which would be ok with a lot of people.

The Council on Economic Priorities, a New York research organization opposed to the new rule, says the trucking of nuclear waste, which would greatly increase, "raises the specter of non-military nuclear accidents in which thousands of people die within 30 days and hundreds of thousands later become victims of radiation-induced cancers, and property damage is measured in billions of dollars."

A spokesman for the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, which is in charge of the security and safety of the cargo, said that "if people were not told about it, it would be like anything else passing by. There is practically no radiation."

A spokesman for the Department of Transportation said, "From all we can see, it isn't a serious health hazard." But Marvin Resnikoff of CEP says that the cooled, shielded casks that carry the spent fuel are not adequate for their hazardous cargo. The nuclear industry claims the trucks are "virtually indestructible," but Resnikoff claims the testing requirements are insufficient and of our date.

In the unhappy event that a truck crashed, overturned or rammed into a house, there would be few people in the area who would know what to do.

**FRANKFORT** — The General Assembly completed the task of redrawing its legislative districts yesterday, putting a potentially divisive issue behind it.

The House approved a Senate redistricting plan 73-18 and the Senate approved the House plan 30-5. Both measures now go to the governor. The legislature is required to redraw its legislative boundaries every 10 years to make them as equal as possible in population.

While both plans had created controversy and heated debate in each house, the two chambers abided by their traditional agreement not to tamper with each other's redistricting plans.

The House rejected a last-ditch effort by Rep. Greg Stumbo, D-Prestonsburg, to amend the Senate plan to put all of Prestonsburg in the same senate district.

Stumbo said that the six precincts in Prestonsburg are divided and it will be difficult to determine who votes where.

"We consider this a slap square in the face," Stumbo said.

Rep. Bob Helinger, R-Louisville, took up the banner for Sen. Jon Ackerson, R-Louisville, whose district was moved 200 miles to the southeast in the Senate plan.

Helinger said Ackerson is one of the hardest working legislators he knows and "it is not fair, not right, no matter which party is doing it."

Noting that Ackerson had won re-election by a two-to-one margin, Helinger said "they were not able to defeat Senator Ackerson at the polls, now he is being defeated with a pencil."

**FRANKFORT** — The state Senate, with no debate, voted 29-2 yesterday to approve Gov. John Y. Brown's reorganization of the state Public Service Commission.

The vote partially fulfilled Brown's prediction earlier this year that the General Assembly would not significantly challenge the changes he ordered in the commission's structure.

Shortly after the 1980 legislature adjourned, Brown signed an executive order merging the state's utility and energy regulatory commissions into a single PSC, despite the General Assembly's rejection of a bill with the same objective.

Although the senators did not debate the matter yesterday, several explained their votes, using that opportunity to speak of their misgivings about the bill.

Sen. Robert R. Martin, D-Richmond, had reservations about the bill, saying the Senate would not be considering such a measure if the legislature were truly independent.

However, Martin added in voting for the bill, he did not believe two regulatory boards resulted in good management and he supported the concept of a single PSC.

The reorganization bill, sponsored by Sen. William L. Quinlan, D-Louisville, now goes to the House.

**BOSTON** — Former Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger was "alert," talking to doctors, and visiting his wife yesterday, one day after four-and-one-half hours of open heart surgery to relieve three clogged arteries.

"We are all very pleased," said one of the surgeons, Dr. Mortimer J. Buckley Jr. "The major risk is over."

Martin Bander, spokesman for Massachusetts General Hospital, said Kissinger was "fully awake, alert and resting comfortably. He started talking to doctors after a tube inserted into his throat was removed this morning."

The tube was hooked up to a respirator which controlled Kissinger's breathing during the triple bypass operation, he said.

The 58-year-old Nobel Peace Prize winner was officially listed in stable condition in his hospital's intensive care unit. Doctors gave him permission to see guests, including his wife, Nancy.

Members of Kissinger's medical team said Wednesday they were satisfied with the results of the lengthy operation and predicted a full recovery for the world-famous diplomat.

After a week of recuperation, Kissinger should be able to get up and move around his room for several minutes at a time, hospital officials said.

**ATLANTA** — Jurors in Wayne B. Williams' murder trial will be allowed to visit the Chattahoochee River bridge where prosecutors contend Williams disposed of the bodies of two young blacks, a judge ruled today.

Judge Clarence Cooper, acting on a defense request, said a visit to the bridge would help the jury understand evidence presented by prosecutors. He did not set a date or time for the visit.

Williams, a 23-year-old black free-lance

photographer and aspiring talent scout, is charged with murdering Nathaniel Cater, 27, and Jimmy Ray Payne, 21, two of 28 young blacks whose deaths over a 22-month period have been investigated by a special police task force.

There have been no arrests in the 26 other deaths, but prosecutors presented evidence about 10 additional slayings in an effort to show a pattern that might fit the Cater and Payne cases.

Prosecution witnesses placed Williams with a total of seven victims, including Cater and Payne, although Williams has denied knowing any of the 28.

On Wednesday, the defense called a diver, a helicopter pilot, a naturalist and a water flow expert to raise doubts about the state's contention that Williams dumped the bodies of Cater and Payne off the Chattahoochee River bridge.

World

**GENEVA, Switzerland** — American and Soviet negotiators, amid mounting indications of an impasse, conferred for two-and-one-half hours yesterday in the 15th full round of talks on limiting medium-range nuclear arms in Europe.

The session followed a pointed exchange between Washington and Moscow, highlighting the distance between the two sides at the politically sensitive talks.

The Reagan administration said Wednesday it rejects as "spurious" a Soviet proposal to reduce medium-range nuclear strength to "300 units on both sides" by 1990.

A State Department spokesman said the plan would leave untouched the most formidable intermediate-range weapon in the Soviet arsenal, the triple-headed, mobile SS-20 missile.

A major American objective at the talks has been to dismantle the SS-20s.

About 280 SS-20 systems, capable of hitting targets anywhere in Europe, have already been deployed. The West has no comparable intermediate-range weapon in place.

The revised Soviet offer was disclosed Tuesday in Moscow. At the same time, the Kremlin assailed as "absurd" a draft treaty submitted last week by the American delegation.

The United States proposed that both sides dismantle or cancel plans to deploy a variety of sophisticated missile systems. The offer, commonly called the "zero option," been likened by the Kremlin to unilateral disarmament.

## Game intentionally avoids interracial pairing

Although racial segregation is prohibited in the by-laws of the University, there are apparently few objections to separation by color when it comes to the question of interracial dating.

The Holmes Hall House Council's annual "Holmes Hilton Dating Game," held last night, was deliberately segregated according to members of the committee in charge of the game.

On applications for the game distributed to freshmen men and women in the north campus area, the committee included "race" among the questions. Jimmy Estes, Holmes Hall House Council president and a member of the committee, said separate groups of black and white panelists were planned for the game because "we didn't think that a black girl would want to go out with a white guy."

Asked on what criteria the committee based its decision not to run the game on an interracial basis, he said, "It was our moral judgement that we shouldn't do that."

Estes, a foreign language freshman, said plans for a black panel fell through when no applications from black women were received.

Holmes Hall Head Resident Gary Gilmore, an accounting senior, said the decision to segregate the dating game was not intended to "encourage or not to encourage or make stand on" interracial dating, adding that Holmes Hall has held segregated dating games in the past.

He said the race question was included on the application form drawn up by the committee — which has no

freshman, interviewed three potential dates and then chose psychology freshman Cindi Wingate as his date. "She just kind of answered [the questions] the way that appealed to me most," Shipp explained.

Computer science freshman Beth Hill said she entered the contest because "I just thought it was a good way to meet some nice guys and people with the same interests." She chose business economics freshman Eugene Beck as her date.

Joey Breckle, computer science freshman, said he chose fashion merchandising freshman Renee Miller because "I liked the sound of her voice."

David White, civil engineering freshman, was chosen by nursing freshman Lori Stiene because "his answers were really sweet. They weren't nasty like some. They were unique."

## black members — because the "time factor" would not allow interviews with each of the over 40 applicants as to their individual preferences concerning interracial dating.

He said the final selections for the dating game were made by the dating game committee.

Although section III, 3.34 of the Student Code governing prohibits registered student organizations such as the Holmes Hall House Council from "discrimination against any person due to race, color, sex or religious affiliation or belief," Robert Zumwinkle, vice president for student affairs, said he was unsure whether or not the segregation of the dating game would be considered an offense under the code.

"I think that there's a legitimate question here," he said, "but I wouldn't want to come down on either side. . . it would come down to a question of what is sound policy."

Although Chester Grundy, director of minority student affairs, called the question of discrimination "trivial," Darrel Williams, president of the Black Student Union, said it was difficult to determine if discrimination had in fact occurred.

"Obviously, it is a form of discrimination," he said. "They're making the decision (whether or not to date interracially) for (the applicants). But you will have a lot of people who don't want to date interracially."

"I guess in a way it's valid," he said. "You can't force them to do it. That's not really kosher either."

But at least one individual who received an application for the game registered strong objections to the race question. Jewell Hall resident Kathy Beckett, a freshman, said she was offended because the committee "took it upon themselves to whether or not I would like to date a black, a white, a Mexican or whatever."

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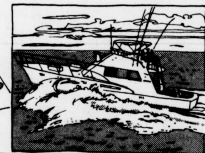

When the ballerina arrives at her destination, she goes up to the person, and "sings part of a song." Then she reads a poem, gives them a big kiss and leaves one candy kiss wrapped in a box," she said.

"We also have a preppy alligator who wears a big red heart for Valentine's Day. He delivers a poem, a balloon bouquet and plays a cassette with a valentine sing-a-gram on it."

Though both of these performers cost around \$30, Sing-a-grams Unlimited has products which range from \$3 to \$50, with an extra charge of \$5 for those who want someone to call in the evenings or on weekends.

The \$50 special is a belly dancer or hula dancer. "They read a poem and dance with the cassette for about five minutes," said Richardson. For

the girls who get a sing-a-gram, there is a dancing man with a bottle of champagne.

"For \$3, a Love-a-gram is mailed first class anywhere. There is a balloon that says love on it. The poem included with it says if you want to add a little excitement to your life on Valentine's Day, blow the balloon up till it pops."

Richardson said, "Also for \$3, we have a balloon that is attached to a candy gift box."

Richardson is featuring a Valentine's special where the alligator comes with a bouquet of pink, white and green balloons for \$30.

"Valentine's is the biggest holiday that I have," Richardson said, "so people should be sure to order early if

they want to order something."

As to the people who receive the singing message, she said, "Their reactions always vary, as people do. But some of them are embarrassed, some are delighted (those are the extroverts), most people are pleased. Even with the most embarrassed people, when we check back with them, we find that they are pleased."

The people at Teddy's Tuck-In get the same type of response from their

activites which include tucking people into bed and telling them a bedtime story.

For Valentine's Day, Theodore or Theodora (the male and female bears who tuck people in) will deliver a heart shaped box of candy and a card, which is optional.

Mike Scott, one of Teddy's bears, said, "We arrive at the room and tell the person to get into bed. Then we give them a bear to cuddle while we

GRESHAM, Ore. — Three Gresham businessmen have designed a generic greeting card to help well-wishers at a loss for words.

The first couple of sales to stores were made directly by the founders.

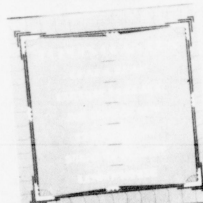

## 'Echos' brings back jazz standards with skill; Cybill Shepherd sings with surprising delight

With the continual growth of jazz, it's great to see several new records turning back to pay dues to some former innovators.

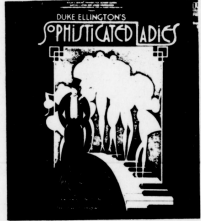
On *Echoes of an Era*, a skillful group of musicians got together and recorded some standards along with some unjustly overlooked pieces. The artists are Chaka Khan (vocals), Freddie Hubbard (flugelhorn & trumpet), Joe Henderson (tenor sax), Chick Corea (piano), Stanley Clarke (acoustic bass) and Lenny White (drums).

Chaka Kahn gives a first rate performance using her voice to its fullest on such cuts as Frank Loesser's "I Hear Music" and "Them There Eyes." It crackles with emotion as she intensifies the already torchy atmosphere of the Gershwin's "I Love You Porgy."

In order to capture the feeling of

improvisation, each song was only recorded twice so the songs wouldn't get too routine. The importance of the moment and the frame of the performers' minds are strongly emphasized.

phased in the two different takes of "All of Me."

The improvisation in *Sophisticated Ladies* occurs in the singing rather than the band as is evident in a comparison of the two versions of "Take the A Train." Gregory Hines and Judith Jameson go into some elaborate scatting of several numbers including the high rising "Bee-Bop." One gets the feeling, though, that their verbal patterns are more practiced than instantaneous since they perform the show eight times a week. The score boasts two hours of great

Ellington music, dynamic showmanship and stunning Terry Kauhaser who has such a sultry voice she almost ignites the record.

An equally pleasant surprise is Cybill Shepherd's voice. In light of her disastrous debut album, I'm surprised anyone let her record anything again. But her voice wasn't suited to her previous material as it is here, and she conveys such a delight in singing that the listener gets caught up in the standards "It Never Entered My Mind" and "I'm Old Fashioned." She has surrounded herself with some great talent including sax-

ophonist Stan Getz who is featured in some cuts as prominently as Shepherd herself. Their greatest moment comes in an all-too-short rendition of "Please Don't Talk About Me When I'm Gone."

Although the hard-core jazz fan might find some of the music on these albums a little tame (nothing here is like Ornette Coleman's work), they provide, nonetheless, a good bridge between swing and jazz.

dards at the dress rehearsal, he grandiloquently importuned them. "Ladies, a little more virginity, if you please."

Then there was the winter night on Broadway when a hacking, sneezing, coughing audience intruded upon his "Hamlet," regarded by the critics as the greatest of its time. Barrymore suddenly reached inside his cloak and tossed a dead fish into the balcony, with the injunction, "Here, chew on this, you damned walruses!"

Another night, another town, another "Hamlet," he broke into a nimble soft shoe after the "What a piece of work is a man, how noble in reason" soliloquy and Rosencrantz and Guildenstern, who had been to the wall in his dressing room, joined in. These anecdotes rush to mind because Monday, Feb. 15, is the centenary of John Barrymore's birth, and careful perusal of the theater listings and movie ads in the morning paper convinces me that there is no one around in his class today, nor has there been in many moons and many rising curtains.

Greta Garbo said he had "that divine madness without which an artist cannot work or live."

Tragically, John Barrymore's

madness was part genius and part gin."

His classic profile, deep resonant voice and ability to immerse himself in any part — Hamlet, Don Juan, Sherlock Holmes, Beau Brummel, Bulldog Drummond, Dr. Jekyll, Richard III. His range was as enormous as Hollywood was ridiculous — made him the highest paid star of his day. But the more the public and critics acclaimed his talents, the more he squandered them.

"Acting," he said, "comes easy and pays well. There's the narcotic." He created dozens of memorable stage roles and starred in more than 60 films, but his life style made Broadway and Hollywood legend.

John Barrymore came to terms with prohibition by setting up a still in his dressing room. He was always

great box office, whether the SRO signs went up for "Dinner at Eight," "Bill of Divorcement" or "Counselor at Law," or whether the crowds came merely to see if the star would appear drunk again.

He starred in a number of great films including *Twentieth Century*, perhaps the greatest film on egotism ever made: *Svengali* and *Naughty Marietta*.

His blazing, brawling marriages to Katherine Harris, Blanche Oelrichs (better known as poetess Michael Strarrie), Dolores Costello and Elaine Barrie established the malicious milieu of the Hollywood gossip column and, as one critic observed, received better coverage than the Ethiopian war. "They all lasted seven years," Barrymore said of his wives, "like some kind of skin rash."

## Wildcats hope to carry 'New Mentalism' into Bama bash

President Reagan wasn't the only one to introduce a new program Feb. 6. His New Federalism, which hit the nation on that historic night, was just one of several changes being made across the land.

For on that same Saturday in the small town of Lexington, Ky., Coach Joe B. Hall and his determined Wildcats set a new trend for the remainder of their 1981-82 season — a change for the better.

Kentucky had just come off a disappointing 67-65 overtime loss down at Auburn and had pledged to turn things around to remain a strong contender in what may be the closest championship race in the history of the SEC. The Cats defeated rival Tennessee 77-67 that night, lightening the race even more and proving that a Kentucky championship was still possible.

The winning trend continued Wednesday night in Rupp Arena, where the Wildcats held off an aggressive Ole Miss squad 56-49, and a superlative

shooting exhibition by Carlos Clark, who netted 30 points.

In that game, Hall said he saw signs of improvement both defensively and offensively, but more importantly, in the mental attitudes of his players — something that had developed in the game with Tennessee.

"I think it is something we woke up to, after our game at Auburn," Hall said yesterday at his weekly press conference. "They were putting a lot of pressure on us down there, and we weren't pressuring them at all. We decided that we had to make some changes in our attack in order to be more effective."

The Wildcats picked up their Mississippi opponents with more aggressiveness at half court, managing 11 steals the first half. Hall contributed it to the team's mental change.

What caused the change? "A determined effort; our backs against the wall; wanting to beat Tennessee," Hall said. "And it was a good time for it. What we accomplished in the Tennessee game, we continued against

Mississippi and it very definitely affected our offense."

The Cats controlled the Ole Miss game offensively — especially in the final minutes by cooling off Clark, whose last basket came with 7:17 to play. But the Wildcats' New Mentalism (which seems to be off to a better start than Reagan's Federalism) must still be taken on the road.

The Wildcats travel to Tuscaloosa for a game with Alabama tomorrow to prove

The UK Katfish, coming off an impressive 75-38 win over the Eastern Kentucky swim team last weekend, hope to continue with what has proven to be their key to success — hard training combined with a positive mental attitude — when they face perennial SEC championship contender Tennessee tonight at Knoxville and Ohio University here tomorrow at 2 p.m.

The test at Tennessee, UK's first meet with the

Volunteers since 1968, will be the most rugged yet for the Katfish, who have run their record to an impressive 6-1 this year. Coach Wynn Paul called the Volunteers "an outstanding team that is one of the best in the nation; definitely in the Top 20."

Paul speculated that Tennessee, which won the SEC swimming championship seven consecutive years during the 70s but has not won the league since 1978 when it captured an NCAA crown, will be tough to beat. But he also

Hall was referring to the Wildcats' position in the conference with regard to Alabama's 73-68 loss at LSU on Wednesday night. That loss dropped Bama to third place, tied with Kentucky at 9-4 and right behind SEC leaders Tennessee and LSU at 10-3.

The Cats defeated Bama 86-69 in an earlier meeting this season in Rupp Arena. In that game, Jim Master's 26 points led Kentucky in an impressive victory on the home court.

Now Alabama is on a two-game losing streak, which began with a 79-69 loss to Ole Miss last Saturday. But Hall said he expects a tough contest when

the two teams take the floor tomorrow night.

"They're a great team at home," he said. "They're probably the nation's best rebounders and we've

got to go down there and play them as hard as we did against Mississippi."

Tipoff for the televised contest (Channel 18 in Lexington) is set for 3 p.m.

sophomore sensation Jeff Bush, who recently collected a couple of UK varsity records.

Said Bush, who has been known to spend as much as five hours per day in the water in training, "The team has been swimming much better than last year and our record shows it. At Tennessee, we'll have a good chance to win some events with the stronger swimmers we have this year... we'll definitely give them a better meet than they think."

Russell has qualified for the NCAA championships on both the one- and three-meter diving boards. He credits the team's success to "everyone being in great shape. Coach (Brigid) DeVries has been working all the divers very hard. The quantity and quality of our workouts has increased (over last year)," he said.

Paul said that his

assistants deserve much of the credit. First-year assistant Chad Knutson has taken over some of the head coach's duties, principally the planning of the team's workouts. A 10-minute stretching program before each workout has helped the swimmers not only to better prepared for the workouts but to prevent injuries as well.

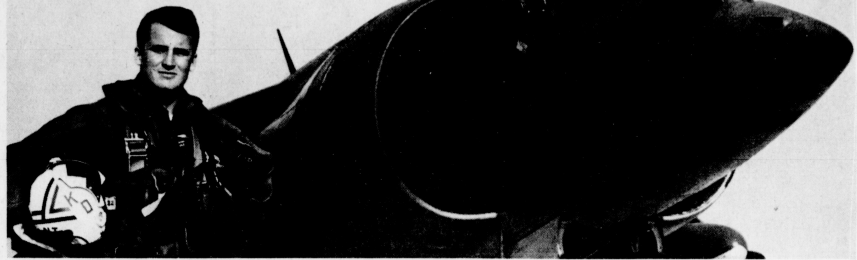
"He has really come in and contributed to this program," Paul said of Knutson. "This has allowed me to do more in the areas of recruiting and other administrative duties for the team. Chad has a real feel for the spirit and conditioning of the team."

The team is looking forward to the SEC championships March 4-6 in Tuscaloosa — but first, it must deal with Tennessee and Ohio U., as well as a regular season-ending dual meet with Western Kentucky.

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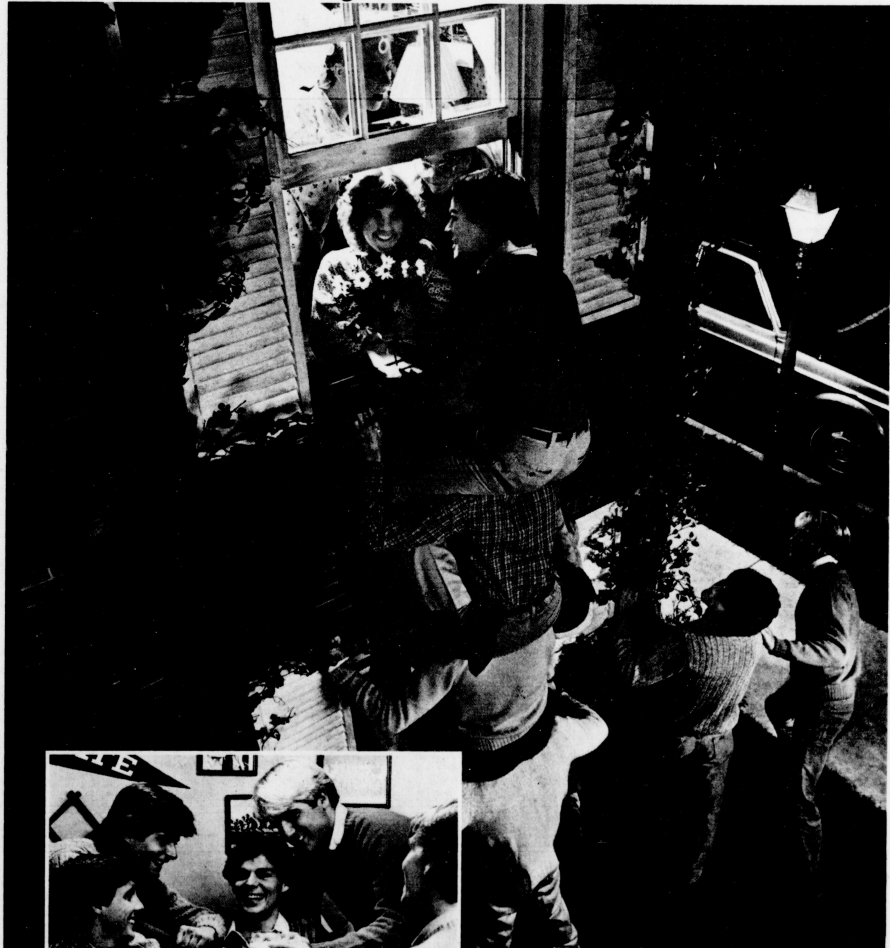
