This Indenture made this fourth day of December eighteen hundred and sixteen between John M. Dowell of Bullitt County and State of Kentucky of the one part and Leonard Troutman of Nelson County and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said John M. Dowell for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar current money of the United States to him in hand paid by the said Leonard Troutman. The Receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and forever acquit and discharge the said Leonard Troutman and his heirs forever find him - man and his heirs forever find him - edred acres of land lying and being in the said County of Nelson on the Beech fork at or near the mouth of Lick Creek. and bounded as follows to wit. Beginning at the South East corner of Pauls Bromans twenty five acres Survey. a long locust and Walnut on the bank of the Beech fork about two poles above the mouth of Lick Creek. Thence East two hundred and six poles up the river to an ash and hickory on the bank of the Beech fork. thence North ten degrees East four hundred poles to Lick Creek
