

Agreement made and entered into this 21st
day of January 1850 between Wm^d Slaughter
James D Larue and Franklin Troutman of the one
part, and Elijah Mobley of the other part. —

Witnesseth, the said Wm^d Slaughter,
James D Larue and Franklin Troutman, have
this day rented to Elijah Mobley, the farm
on the Bards Town road, and known by the
name of the John Dix^s farm untill the 10th
day of March 1851. for which said Mobley
binds himself to pay said Slaughter, Larue
and Troutman, Thirty Dollars, provided
the orchard should this year bear fruit
abundantly, and if not only twenty dollars,
and he binds himself to make good shingled
and recover the house in a workmanlike
manner, for which he is to have a credit
of ten dollars towards the rent, the rent
to be paid at the end of the time to wit on
the 10th day of March 1851. In witness
whereof we have hereto set our hands
the day and year first written. —
