

Know all men by these presents that I Moses Moore of Nelson County and District of Kentucky am held and firmly bound unto Michael Lacasagne of Jefferson County and District aforesaid in the Just Sum of Four hundred & forty one pound twelve Shillings & Six pence current money to be paid to the said Michael Lacasagne his certain attorney, his heirs, Exrs, and admrs, to the which payments to be made and done I bind myself my heirs, Exrs, and admrs, jointly & severally and firmly by these presents sealed with my seal and dated this fifth day of December 1787.

The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Moses Moore his heirs, Exrs or admrs, do and shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the above and Michael Lacasagne his heirs, Exrs, admrs or assigns the full quantity of one thousand pounds of good merchantable butter deliverable in Kegs at this place on or before the twenty fifth day of this instant as well as five hundred weight of tallow also merchantable and deliverable as this place - Besides the full quantity of Ten thousand six hundred & Twenty four pounds of good merchantable Bacon in hams & middling in the usual proportion to be delivered at this place on or before the thirty first day of March
