This Indenture made this 29<sup>th</sup> day of September  
in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred &  
Six Between Lewis Craig of the County of Franklin  
& State of Kentucky of the one part and John Souille of  
the County of Woodford & State aforesaid of the other part  
Witnesseth that the said Lewis Craig for and  
in consideration of the sum of One thousand dollars  
current money hath bargained, sold, aliened and  
confirmed and by these presents doth grant, bargain  
sell, alien & confirm unto the said John Souille &  
his heirs forever, a certain tract or parcel of land situ-  
ate, lying & being in the County of Woodford and bounded  
as follows viz: Beginning at two sugar trees corner  
to Egbert thence with the line of the original survey  
South 7<sup>th</sup> West 175 poles to a stake corner to Mitchell  
& Robert Oneal by the said Souille's fence, thence with  
the original line N. 83. W. 250 poles to a honey locust &  
Mulberry stump corner to John Moseby, thence with his  
line N. 12. E. 145. poles to a honey locust corner to Egbert's  
old survey & with his original line N. 88 1/2 E. 228 poles  
to the beginning, containing two hundred & forty four  
acres, being a part of Robert Oneal's 1000 acres, with  
all & singular its appurtenances. To Have &  
To Hold the aforesaid tract of land with its ap-  
-purtenances unto the said John Souille & his heirs  
forever to his & their only proper use & behoof  
And the said Lewis Craig for himself his heirs &  
doth covenant to & with the said John Souille  
& his heirs the aforesaid tract of land with its  
appurtenances
