Honey please excuse this paper. It all I could find & its too hot to hunt for some thing better. Today is really a scorcher. We got up & went to nine o'clock mass. It was powerful hot even then. I have to get dressed when I finish this letter. I guess we'll walk over to the park or just stay at home. Its so hot I guess it would be terrible over in the park. I want to go in town tomorrow if it isnt too hot. I'm going to get some dress material. I havent any summer clothes at all. If my allotment doesnt hurry & come I dont know what I'll do. I need so many things. I wish you would send me about two or three dollars if you can spare it. I owe the doctor some more

money & I haven't any way to pay him.
I thought my allotment would be here by
now & I told him I'd pay him then. But
I guess I'll have to write to Washington &
see why I haven't gotten it. Darling, don't
send me the money if you can't afford to.
I guess he'll wait until next month but
I hate to owe any body & it would ease
my conscience if he were paid. Just
don't send it if you have to do without
some thing else. Maybe I can borrow some
from mom.

Honey, what are the titles of the new
Capt. North books you bought? Save

Darling Sonny. I miss you so much on Sundays. The day seems so lonesome & dull. I miss you more all the time. I'm so crazy about you & want you so damned much. The park has three times as many soldiers this year as it did last year. So you can imagine how crowded it is. There are very few civilians left. The soldiers really have taken over here. either that or stay at home so I go out.
But it gets awfully tiresome. I really
am ungrateful I know because mom
goes out of her way to try to make me
enjoy myself. I guess I shouldn't be so
mean. I'll have to turn over a new leaf.
But you can appreciate how I feel. You
wouldn't like it either. But it's only for
a short while & then I'll be with you
again & I can begin living again.

soldiers & girls. Bud Brashear is home

so wish you could get a furlough. It
seems as though everyone is getting home.
Did your mother tell you that Louie
Effinger is down in Florida? I thought
he was still at Ft. Knox. The boy next
door is still out there & he's been in
since November. Some people have all
the luck. I thought he would be moved

when he flunked O.C. S. He sure is lucky.

I haven't the slightest desire to go out with any
one else. So please sorry, don't write things like
that. It makes me feel as if you don't think I

a walk over to John's or go down to Snider's. But
the front porch suits me just as well. You should
have been here last night. Sis had a date with
two soldiers & they both came. One came in the
afternoon. He's the one she likes & he stayed on
& on until the other one came about 7 o'clock.
The last one got mad & he wouldn't even speak
to the first one. Finally Sis called Lillian & asked
her to come over & help her out. Well, Sis, Lillian,
Mrs. Grib, Norman, the two soldiers & myself
went down to the inside Gypsy Village. This one
sat there & wouldn't say a word. He dined with

Sis + told her he was very angry. She took off

I got three letters from you today & in one of them was the insurance paper & the money order for \$5. Thank you angel, you shouldn't have sent it to me. I don't need any money so just keep all you get & don't worry about me. I don't need anything & I can get along until the allotment comes. Just have a good time on your money & don't bother about me. Honey, you sounded as if you are mad at me because I can't come to Utah. I know it's a big disappointment to you. Maybe you should have married some girl who could follow you all around the country & not an old weakling like me. I'm sorry I can't take it but it's not

my fault. I'd gladly come if I could. I'll
try to come to Iowa when you go there but Sonny
& I haven't any money & I don't see how I could
possibly come ^{now} even if I could stand the trip.
You made me feel like a heel because I
hate to have you think I'm a disappointment.
But I guess I am. I don't blame you for
wanting to down your sorrows when you go to
Iowa. I guess I'm just a failure as far
as being a wife is concerned. Please don't

Please try to + don't start going out with other girls just to forget me. I love you + if you get angry with me I'll just fine away + die. Did your mother tell you that June is going to have a baby? That's nice, isn't it? It's a shame her husband is over in Africa. She must feel terrible if she loves him as much as I love you.

I think the war will be over soon. The paper

give up & then the boys will be cleaned up in
nothing flat. I hope so. I pray all the time
that it will soon end & you & all the other
boys can come home safely. I'll try my best
to come down. I would love to, Sonny, please
believe me. I feel so awful because I can't.
If I had the money I'd gladly come tomorrow.







I want you to take good care of yourself. I love you more than any thing & I'm so eager to be with you again. I hope all our dreams & prayers come true soon. I don't see how this war could last much longer. Some people say it might be over by the first of the year. Wouldn't that be wonderful? I wouldn't know how to act if you were home. I'm so lonesome & miserable all the time that all that happiness of being together would be a shock to me. I'm so hungry for you & I want you so much. I love everything about you. You haven't even one fault. Isn't it wonderful that we never quarrel with each other or have fights like some married people do? Of course I guess we haven't lived together long enough for that. But we didn't even quarrel when we were going together & that was three years? I think it's really a record. Some couples have quarrels all the time &
