A few years later the queen died. Everything was sad then. But soon it was forgotten.

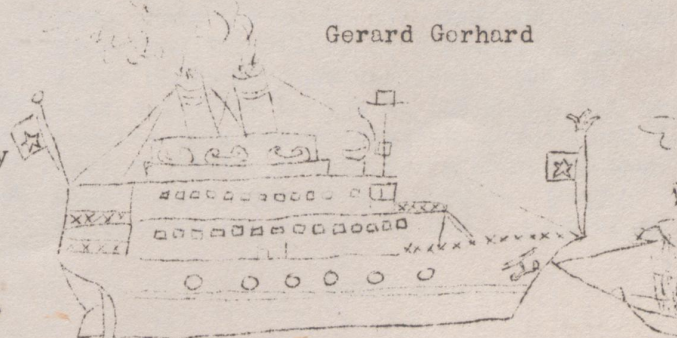
