### Senate Investigates **U-High Activities**

Washington, D.C., March 31—OP Senator J. Thomas Overboard (Dem. Ky.) has asked the committee on Un-American activities to investigate the rumors of subversive acts at his old high school—Uni-versity High School of Lexington, Kentucky. In a four hour speech to a joint session of Congress, Sen. Overboard said it was a crime to allow such severe breaches of the American way of life to continue un-inhibited. To assist his views on the subject, the senator advocated a complete purge of all concerned and requested that Congress order the Army, Navy, Air Force and Space Patrol to converge on the school and put a stop to the "bloody co-
