The faculty met pursuant to the call of the president, those present being President Patterson, professors J. G. White, Patterson, Pryor, Anderson, Mathews, Miller, Pence, Mackenzie, Norwood, Burr, M. White, Wilson, Tuttle, Gumbrod, Rowe and Frankel.

Halloway case.

Prof. Norwood chairman of com. appointed to recommend appro. action in Halloway case reported as follows.

A meeting of the Committee was held Thursday afternoon, November 22, at 4 o'clock. Those present were Professors Mathews, Miller, Tuttle and Norwood; the absence of Professor J. G. White being accounted for by the fact that the Chairman failed to notify him in time.

The Chairman was directed to report as follows:

"Your Committee finds that Messrs. Veal and Jett, by their own confessions, were both guilty of riotous conduct, aggravated in the case of Mr. Jett by the violation of an express regulation of the College which forbids the having of a pistol in his possession; and we recommend that the Faculty, as penalties therefor, reduce Mr. Veal to the ranks and suspend Mr. Jett for an indefinite period."

Prof. Gumbrod seconded by Dr. Pryor moved the adoption of the report. Several amendments were offered and finally a substitute offered by Prof. Norwood and seconded by Prof. Miller that Mr. Veal should be suspended for an indefinite period, was carried, it having been informally agreed that the cases of Messrs. Veal and Jett should be acted upon separately.

Prof. Mackenzie moved as an amendment which was seconded by W. K. Patterson that he be suspended dismissed.

The amendment for dismissal was lost by the vote as follows.

Prof. Miller seconded by Prof. Mackenzie moved that Mr. Check be suspended for an indefinite period. Several amendments were proposed in this case but finally on motion of C. W. Mathews the case against Mr. Check was dismissed on the ground that he had committed no offense of greater gravity than others, and had shown courage in refusing to run away, and in urging upon the police the release of Mr. Bryant, who was not guilty of participation in the "riotous" proceedings.

The vote dismissing the case of Mr. Check is recorded as follows.

The following resolution was introduced upon motion of professor M. White seconded by Prof. Gumbrod.

RESOLVED that hereafter any matriculate of the College who may be indicted and convicted by the civil courts for a misdemeanor or a felony shall ipso facto be dismissed, (and that such convicted misdemeanant or felon can be re-instated only by <sup>action of the faculty.</sup> the mandate of the Executive Committee or <sup>by</sup> the Board of Trustees.

After some discussion it was ordered upon motion of Dr Pryor seconded by Major Burr that action upon this motion be deferred until the next meeting of the faculty.

Prof. Rowe, on behalf of the committee *Stanley Baer* appointed to confer with Stanley Baer in reference to an offensive publication in the Transit, read the following letter from Mr. Baer.

Copy.

Lexington, Ky. Nov. 23, 1906.

To the Gentlemen of the Faculty,

I wish to express to you my sincere regret regarding the objectionable article that appeared in the last issue of the "Transit"

I realize that in permitting matter of a political nature to be published in the Transit, I have made a grave mistake, and am willing to cooperate with you in doing what I can to rectify it.

The next issue of the Transit will contain a retraction, if you so desire it.
