New legislation attempts to fight increase in computer crime

On Friday the Kentucky House of Representatives passed a bill establishing criminal penalties for the illegal use of computers.

House Bill 106, passed on a 94-0 vote, would punish theft or fraud vote, would punish theft or fraud to the control of the control o

It's about time the Kentucky Gen-eral Assembly addresses these crimes, which have become possible

because of the increasing prolifera-tion of computer networks. Wire fraud, which has been the usual charge in such cases, is a poor stitute for specific statutes covering the misuse of computer technology. The possibility of misuse of com-puter resources must even be con-puter resources must even be con-ment at the scademic environ-ment at the scademic environ-ment at the prime computing system, which is used for teaching.

The policy states, "Disciplinary or legal action may be taken against

ministering all the accounts in the Department of Computer Science.
