GLSO launches new Membership Program

As promised, the GLSO has created a new way for you to donate!

Many of our frequent supporters had been asking us to start a program that allowed them to make a recurring monthly donation so that they could provide the same level of support for the GLSO's community programs without having to spend time writing a check every month. We heard you.

We are proud to introduce the GLSO Member Program. By partnering with an online processing service, we have created a secure system where you can set up a recurring donation of \$5, \$10, \$20 or \$50 monthly. Your donation will automatically recur each month, charged to either your credit or debit card, for a whole year.


This program has a donation amount to fit every budget. If you're on a limited income, but still want to show your support for the GLSO, the \$5 monthly donation is only a commitment of \$60 per year. A Positive View of LGBTQ Identities

Ellen Riggle and Sharon Rostosky, professors at the University of Kentucky, have recently published a book that focuses on the positive themes in LGBTQ lives. The book, A Positive View of LGBTQ: Embracing Identity and Cultivating Well-Being, includes stories that people shared when asked the simple but novel question, "What is positive about having a lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, or queer identity?" The answers focus on themes such as personal authenticity and insights, having stronger relationships with family and

friends, flexibility in gender expression and roles, increased compassion for others, fighting for social justice, and a sense of community belonging. The book includes exercises to inspire readers to cultivate their own positive narratives and strengths.


The group is a support group, not therapy. This year, there will be a topic every third Wednesday.



LGBT Writing Contest Reading


On Thursday, February 23 at 7 pm there will be a reading by winners and finalists of the LGBT writing contest conducted by the Carnegie Center.


The Carnegie Center is located at 251 W. Second St. There is no charge to attend. Individuals submitting work to this contest could identify in any way but their writing was focused on lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender life

The Carnegie Center will announce the winners in early February.

This reading will be one of the first of its kind in Kentucky. GLSO has held readings of personal work during a number of Pride Month celebrations.

This event is the first to bring together a wide variety of writers and will be advertised throughout Lexington and surrounding communities. The contest and reading is supported by a generous grant from JustFund KY.





Q... Hi Cousin, As a straight single mom, I have a few friends that I suspect are bi-curious, lesbian and even gay. Should a gay person expect to lose their straight friends when and if they come out and where can one find gay friends?

CQ...Many say that they have more straight friends now that they're "out", and that they're a lot happier and more confident since coming out. It's easier to be close to people when you're not hiding anything and when you're comfortable with yourself. In Kentucky, many have had horrible experiences coming out. Particularly in the smaller and rural areas, discrimination against gays is still strong. If they want to come out to friends, be careful to trust only friends who will respect their privacy and confidentiality. Friends who tend to gossip can cause problems, even if they don't mean to hurt them. Some friends will be supportive right away. Both guys and girls say it's generally easier to come out to girls. They may find that they already have gay friends and didn't even know. Most cities have organizations where they're able to meet people easily. The GLSO is a great place to network yourself with many different organizations in KY and become involved in and meet new people. You'll find new friends with whom you can share experiences and support and learn more about yourself. Gay people joke sometimes about having "gaydar", a type of "radar" for telling who is and isn't gay. Figuring out who is gay, if they're not completely "out", is like figuring out if someone's interested in you. Sometimes you can tell, sometimes you can't. They will get better at it with experience.


