Landlords hope to avoid stricter student resident policy

regulations state that only three non-related students can live in an off-campus house at a time and that no student residential unit can exist within approximately 150 to 200 square feet of anothers to the control of the control o

community," Wiseman said. "We need to understand (the regulations) more than we do now."

The housing association, made up of landlords who own property around UK, hopes that with collaboration from Lexington landlords and UK students it can stop Lexington from applying similar regulations, which would render about 75 percent of student houses surrounding campus ineligible for student occupation, said Andy Melntire, UAHA member and property owner.

The decrease in available housing would effectively drive the student population into other Lexington neighborhoods, Melnitre said, has got to be a "We think that that," he said. "(The regulations) would force students out

into other neighborhoods further away from campus, increasing the possibility of conflict with other neighbors. We don't believe this discrimination should be something we are teaching at the university."


Residents of neighborhoods surrounding UK have expressed concern with student behavior, particularly after the University of Louisville football game. A house was condemned and a couch was burned outside after latenight partying.

UAHA Vice President Robert Hodges said he believes the problem stems from a lack of communication between the city, landlords and their tenants.

"We have a long-term need to have landlords and their tenants."







"Tell your boss that tomorrow, the first thing we are going to do is close down his restaurant," warned the second interrogator, who was wearing a thick red armband that read "Morality Police."

The Morality Police have come to the Palestinian Authority. Only the charge isn't be ing led by hardliners from the militant Islamist Hamas movement, as many once feared, it's being spearheaded by the secular Fatah party as part of its campaign to undermine growing support for Hamas in the West Bank.

U.S. combat deaths drop again in Iraq

WASHINGTON — U.S. military deaths in Iraq fell to their lowest point in more than a year in September, figures show, a continuation of a four-month decline in combat casualties that has analysts debating why.

Sixty-four American service members died in Iraq in September, according to icasualties.org, which operates the Iraq Coalition Casualty Count Web site. Of those, 43 died from hostile action, according to the site, which tracks the casualties of U.S. and other coalition countries.

The last time the U.S. death toll was that low was in July 2006, when 43 troops died, 38 of them in hostile action.


This year, deaths peaked in May, when This year, deaths peaked in May, when Storops died, 120 of them in hostile action. Since then, the number of troops killed by hostile action has fallen each month, despite predictions from American commanders that they would rise once the U.S. troop buildup was completed and the U.S. began more aggressive action. That buildup was completed in June.

The last month when IED cessaulties were that low was Februsiary, when IEDs claimed 27 American lives; 81 U.S. troops died in Iraq that month.

Those statistics include EFPs, explosively formed penetrators, which can pierce armor. Top military commanders in Iraq have said those devices are coming from Iran.

The U.S. began increasing the number of troops in Iraq in February, adding five combat brigades in a so-called "surge" strategy that was completed in June. U.S. troops then began a series of offensives in Baghdad and in conflicted areas north and south of the capital that American commanders had said would likely result in higher U.S. casualties. the top industrialized countries to forgive loans.





SG needs changes after ticket-resale controversy

Student Government's response to the ticket-resule controversy should not be just to rebuke the two senators who sold tickets to an SG-sponsored concert at a profit, but to overhalus IGS procedures for preventing and responding to potential ethical lapses. There is little to be said for Sens, Jesse Parrish and Blake Burnett, who bought tickets for last month's SG-sponsored Corey Smith concert at the discounted Greek rate of \$5 and resold them at their \$15 list price. Proceeds from the concert went to UK's Violence Intervention and Prevention Center, meaning those \$10 profits could have gone toward fighting sexual assault instead of lining two SG senators' pockets.

But Parrish already conceded in a Sept, 26 letter to the Kernel that his actions were "just plain stupid" and promised that he and Burnett would

Sept. 20 letter to the Kernet that his actions were "just plain stupid" and promised that he and Burnett would donate their personal profits to the VIP Center. Barring further revelations about their conduct, it seems the case is closed as far as they're concerned.

However, that doesn't mean noth

However, that doesn't mean nothing more should come from the situation, which made it clear that SG would benefit from some self-examination on ethics.
First, SG needs to make sure its officers and senators understand their responsibilities as public officials. They cannot act under the pretense that there is a neat divide between their personal lives and their roles as SG officeholders or legislators—sometimes, as in the ticket-resale case, the roles are burred.
Perhaps it is unjust for students to reach conclusions about SG as a whole based on some of its officials actions as private cliziens, but that is bound to happen. When SG senators act questionably, even on their own time and without sanction from its mean constraints in higher-ups—a situation all of its officials have an interest in avoiding.

Second, the process of investigat-ing potential ethical violations is far too cumbersome. President Nick Phelps and the Senate should begin working on a way to streamline it.

The initial step of the current process, according to the \$G\$ Code of Ethics, is for someone who believes a violation has occurred to file a complaint. Then, the \$G\$ Supreme Court's chief justice forms a 15-person ethics commission made up of students who are independent from \$G\$. The chief justice selects a three-person subpanel from the full commission, along with an attorney general from outside the ethics commission.

The attorney general, with the help of the three-person subpanel, spearheads an investigation into whether the actions listed in the complaint violated \$G\$'s ethics code. The subpanel submistia a report to be approved by the full ethics committee. However, the committee's decision is non-binding; after the group makes a recommendation, it is up to the \$G\$ Senate's Impeachment and Censure Committee to take action based on the findings.

Ultimately, those efforts can't succeed without a workable, quick process for dealing with allegations of impropriety.

Jena 6 protests show power of free speech

In an often all-too-cynical political atmosphere we face today, it was heartening to see students on campus take part in the nationwide Jena 6 protest Sept. 20. Regardless of where one stands on the controversial issue itself, there is merit in utilizing the First Amendment appropriately and effectively — which is exactly what UK students did.

Following a period of elevated racial tension in a Louisiana high school, six black students assaulted a single white student, resulting in the arrest of the individuals now being referred to as "the Jena 6." In the time that has followed, several protests like the one on UK's campus have sought to draw attention to what protesters claim are unfairly severe, and racially motivated charges ranging from second degree assault to attempted murder, according to a Kernel article on Sept. 21.

The racially sensitive nature of the case has been at the heart of the protests. Delta Sigma Theta Secretary Kimber Hatton said in the article that he case was "racial injustice (and)

charged from the get go," In support of this and similar claims, several students exercised their First Amendment rights of petition and assembly as they gathered outside the Student Center to protest and sign a petition to release the six students charged.

While there are obviously multiple sides to this case, it has at least caused many college students to shrug off their trademark political apathy. And it seems their efforts could be working.

On Sept. 1, the Third Circuit Court of Appeals in Louisiana overturned the conviction of Mychal Bell, who was the first student tried and was convicted of aggravated battery, according to the Kernel article.

Students all across the country should take notice of this event and realize that they could use the same influence exercised here in any control-

Regardless of the specific stance one takes on the Jena 6, it is still a stunning example of grassroots ac-tivism among our nation's youth and a reminder that protests can do more than just carbonics: They can incite significant cretanoise: They can incite significant change.


