CHICAGO — Police are concluding that the former academic star
who shot and killed five students last
week at Northern Illinois University

"That's the one thing I want to

"We don't have anything to know or
even-begin to assume a motive yet."

Among the other unanswered questions are why Kazmierczak targeted that particular building and class and why he carried out the massacre on valentine's Day, Grady said. There were no clues in the notor or package he sent his former girlifriend shortly before the attack, he said.

"He didn't tell people what he was going to do," he said. "And he took steps to thwart any investigation."

Investigators have obtained several search warrants, Grady said, triculating one to search Kazmierczak's Honda. The vhicle was listed in a 2006 traffic ticket as a white 2001 model.

The salads are one healthy option, with the Char-grilled Chicken Garden Salad containing only 180 calo-location of the containing only 180 calo-location of the containing only 180 calo-location of the containing 240 calories and eight grams of fat, according to Chick-fil-AS Web site (www.chickfila.com). The eight-count order of chicken nuggets has 260 calories and 13 grams of fat and the Char-grilled Chicken Sandwich has 270 calories and 3.5 grams of fat. A good way to avoid racking up calories at Chick-fil-A, too, is to avoid the fries and opt for a healthier side. Chick-fil-A offers a fruit cup for only 60 calories with no fat and a chicken soup with only 140 calories and 3.5 grams of fat per serving.

Arby's can be a tough place to find good food, with most of its options soaring up into the 300- to 500-caloric range per item. Like the other two chains mentioned above, one of the healthest options is a salad. The Martha's Vineyard Salad contains 276 calories and eight grains of fat, according to Arby's Web site (www.arbys.com). The

next best option is the Jr. Roast Beef sandwich, which contains 273 calories and 10 grams of fat If you absolutely must indulge in an order of Arby's cuty fries, keep in mind that even the small serving has 338 calories and 20 grams of feet.

Jimmy John's

Jimmy John's offers one thing that many other restaurants don't: a fully customizable menu. You can pick and choose what you want on your sandwich, which can ultimately save you hundreds of calories. For example, stay away from their mayonnaise at all costs. It adds at least a hundred calories, if not more, to your sandwich, and often isn't worth the extra fat, either. They offer Dijon mustard as a tasty alternative. Try making your sandwich an "Unwich," too, to save calories on bread. An "Unwich," too, to save calories on bread. 

Doctors: Prozac, violence rarely linked

CHICAGO — In the wake of Steven Kazmierczak's mur-derous shooting spree at North-ern Illinois University, law en-forcement officials noted he had begun to behave erratically after he recently stopped taking psy-chiatric medication.

That fact might seem to of-That fact might seem to of-fer a tidy explanation for his rampage, or at least some in-sight into his troubled mind. But

sight into his troubled mind. But psychiatrists say suspending a patient's use of antidepressants — Prozae, in Kazmierczak's case — is rarely linked to violence toward others.

When used under a therapits's supervision, they stress, such medication can help people overcome depression and other mental aitments. And while the mind remains a mystery exterts

mental ailments. And while the source of Kazmierczak's state of mind remains a mystery, experts said it's unlikely that halting his Prozae therapy would have led directly to his shooting plot.

At the same time, psychia-rists say, his case may help reinforce a key lesson: Stopping anti-depressant therapy suddenly can be risky if patients do not follow a doctor's instructions and don't report any negative effects.

About one-fifth of people who halt a course of Prozae-like drugs report symptoms associated with a condition known as discontinuation in the control of the co
