#### CollegeFreshmen Tend To Reject **Human** Liberties

Freshmen enrolled in colleges this year are part of an age group that does not value the human rights guaranteed by our constitution.

On the contrary, they have expressed disapproval toward the civil liberties which we enjoy today. It is a startling discovery and one that should be given a great deal of thought, especially by the freshmen.

Evidently our high schools have failed to implant in students the basic concepts of our way of life. Either they have been misinformed or have not been informed at all. As a result, the students enter college unaware of the importance of the rights so long sought after and finally attained by our ancestors.

At present there seems to be hard feelings among students toward those who are fortunate enough to have permits for parking in choice places on campus. The remainder must park off campus some distance from their classes. Since students have made up their minds to be bitter about the problem, some definite action ought to be taken in releving the situation.

The most logical plan would be to do away with the issuance of permits except to the physically handicapped. Faculty members are among the very first to arrive for classes and should find no difficulty in finding parking spaces near their offices. In regard to the commuter . . . he has access to parking facilities on or near campus, as does every other student. He should not be fortunate enough to get one of the more convenient parking places, it is no more of a hardship on him than the majority of students to walk an extra few blocks to classes.

Such a plan has worked in other universities. Since all other measures appear to have failed, why wouldn't it he worth a try here? The constant complaining from the students indicates that the dissatisfaction will continue. It is a sign of weakness when the University is unable to cope with such a problem successfully.


