Exam measures TAs' English skills

UK teaching assistants represent various cultures from around the world, selected on the basis of academic exellence in their fields. Many students, however, have indicated through complaints to department has das and ombudsmen that this wealth of intelligence is of little value them because they have difficulty understanding TAs' speech.

Large universities around the United States with significant percentages of foreign graduate students are facing graduate students are facing similar problems. Some UK administrators, however, are examining a new test that would gauge TAs or all inadequacies, according to Wimberly Royster, graduate school dean.

The Test of Spoken English (TSE), an oral proficiency exam, is only one year old but has been the subject of contro-

versy.
"We're aware of it (the TSE) and still looking at it," Royster said. "We're trying to



Test gauges linguistic ability of foreign teaching assistants

The Test of Spoken English, which has been available for one year, is an exam designed to measure the linguistic ability of "mon-native" speakers whose communicative skills are crucial for instructing students.


Across America, most foreign students are required to take TOEFL.

(Test of English as a Foreign Language) while applying for Graduate School. While TOEFL gauges vocaburalry, grammar and written skills, it doesn't involve oral proficiency.

According to Rodney J. Ballard, TSE program director, the TSE is given in an interview type format, but a live interviewer is not used. Instead a taper or an interviewer is not used.
