Expulsion of
Caret M'Bray
& Shrader

The Faculty met in called meeting in the President's room. Present were: The President, Prof. Shackford, White, Peter, Craswell, Meane, Kroy, W. K. Patterson, Peace, Kretzler, Col. Tyler. Object of meeting, investigation of charges against Caret, M'Bray & Shrader. The charges are, that they have been intoxicated and introduced prostitutes into the dormitory in the night from Nov. 24th - Nov. 25th a.c. The testimony of Caret, O'Banahan and Meane as to the facts was heard. On being arraigned the accused plead guilty as to the charges as above. It having been stated by the Com^{tee} of Caret, that both the accused had been especially warned against drinking, Prof. Shackford moved, that they be publicly expelled. Motion seconded and carried unanimously.

Standard time

Refusal of
