

### **Prince Charles praises Harvard**

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. - Harvard University celebrated

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. — Harvard University celebrated its 300th birthday yesterday with Britain's Prince Charles calling for a rebirth in education that gives young peole "standards to live by."

Dressed in the dragon-emblazoned gold silk robe of the University of Wales, where he is chancellor, Charles drew applause when he told 20,000 alumni, guests and faculty of the nation's oldest university:

"We should never lose sight of the fact that to avert disaster we have not only to teach men to make things, but also to produce people who have complete moral control over the things they make."

The heir to the British throne, musing on the switch in world roles of the United States and Great Britain since Harvard's founding in 1636, said "the wheel has turned full circle and now the United States with all its power and influence and commercial might can sometimes evoke anxious reactions across the Atlantic."

### 'Twilight Zone' makers called careless

LOS ANGELES — The makers of "Twilight Zone: The Movie" were portrayed by a prosecutor Wednesday as careless men who placed children in harm's way and caused their violent deaths.

But a defense attorney at the opening of the long-awaited involuntary manslaughter trial said an explosive expert is to blame for the 1982 tragedy that killed actor Vic Morrow and two small children.

Defense lawyer James Neal, calling the movie-set accident "unforeseen and unforseeable," told jurors the blast that sent a helicopter careening to the ground was caused by a special effects operator who triggered explosives at the wrong time.

### Reagan decides to renew limited sanctions

SANTA BARBARA, Calif. - President Reagan, refusing to impose tougher sanctions against South Africa, or-dered a one-year extension yesterday of a package of lim-ited steps that the administration acknowledged "has not

done what we intended it to do."

Reagan held out the possibility he may order additional sanctions later to increase pressure on the white-ruled government in Pretoria, after consultations with allies.

### Soviet captain accused of violations

MOSCOW — The captains of two ships that collided in the Black Sea, killing up to 400 people, are being held under guard and are accused of violating navigational safetyrules, official Soviet news reports said today.

A Communist Party official, meanwhile, said 37 more bodies had been recovered, bringing to 116 the number confirmed dead in the crash about midnight Sunday. Another 282 people are missing and believed dead.

Albert 1. Vlasov, first deputy chief of the party propaganda department, released the new figures at a news conference. He said the cruise liner Admiral Nakhimov apparently sank seven or eight minutes after colliding with the ently sank seven or eight minutes after colliding with the freighter Pyotr Vasyev — about twice as fast as earlier thought and too quickly to deploy any lifeboats.

# Riots

Witnesse gave this account of the scene in Soweto:
Most shops were closed. Commuters going to work in the morning and returning in the evening were lashed with whips and pelled with stones.
After the stadium riot, mourners left the Regina Mundi Roman Catholic Church in a long convoy to bury some of last week's riot victims at Avaion cemetery.
A dozen policemen entered the church, stopping the service, and others lobbed two tear gas canisters from an armored car into a bus carrying people to the cemetery.

Police fired more tear gas at the cemetery and moved up a dozen armored cars to disperse several thousand mourners.

Security forces continued partolling large areas of Soweto in late afternoon, more than nine hours after the violence began. They tore down barricades, many of which were rebuilt when the armored trucks moved on, and parked by the Soweto Freeway in the afternoon watching for returning workers who had ignored the boycott.

Gangs of youths stoned buses

with the slogan, "Soweto Mas

They formed a procession in the White City area, chanting slogans for the banned African National Congress guerrilla movement and its imprisoned leader, Nelson Mandela.

A helicopter swooped in and dropped tear gas canisters. The young men scattered to at least five neighborhoods and built more barricades of burning tires, rocks and garbage cans.

The Bureau for Information re-ported fire-bombings; it did not say how many there were nor gave any details except to say eight people were arrested in one incident. It confirmed that "po-lice used tear gas on a number of occasions to disperse illegal gath-erings."

Last week's Soweto violence produced the largest death toll in a single outburst of township violence since the latest uprising against white domination began two years ago.

More than 2,100 people have been killed, nearly all of them black, since September 1984.


