

SGA responsibility overrides legalities

Last May, the state attorney general issued an opinion which said that university student governments don't have to comply with the open meetings law.

The opinion was requested by Western Kentucky Unversity's student paper. The College Heights Herald. A Herald reporter was forced to leave a student government meeting while personnel matters were discussed. The paper's editor felt the open meetings law was being violated.

The attorney general believed otherwise.
In short, the opinion, although not legally binding, says that student governments can close their doors to the press—and more importantly you—whenever they meet.

From a legal standpoint, the attorney general's opinion might or might not be disputable.

However, what it fails to do, or perhaps neglects to realize, is the representative nature of a student government. For any student government to do the representative holt input as well as student examination.

Because students both elect and partially fund (in UK's case pay) the representatives, student governments must be held accountable for their actions. This cannot happen behind closed doors. History dictates that secret meetings and deals result in deception and cheating.

Our SGA cannot close its meetings to students because its constitution prohibits it from doing so. Murray St. and the University of Louisville have similar provisions.

However, a constitutional amendment could give our student government the over to do so.

But legalities in this matter become simple technicali-ties. The responsibilities, however, are not.


