Mr. Hall is an alumnus of Harvard and Oxford Universities. His most recent books are Remembering Poets (1978) and Kicking the Leaves (1978). The first contains Hall's account of personal encounters with T.S. Eliot, Robert Frost, Ezra Pound, and Dylan Thomas. The second are poems, many of them reflecting Hall's recent experience of returning to live on his ancestral farm in New Hampshire.

Publications from the King Library Press and music by the Farrar Trio will complete the evening.
