#### **WORLD Christopher tells** Arafat to stop attacks

JERUSALEM — Secretary of State Warren Christopher served notice on PLO Chairman Yasser Arafat yesterday that he must put a stop to Islamic militants' attacks on Israelis if he expects to spread Palestinian self-rule across the West Bank. Christopher also reassured Israel's hard-pressed government that the Clinton administration considers Arafat's security pledges "absolutely fundamental" to peacemaking. The government is deciding whether to pull Israel's army out of Arab towns on the West Bank in the midst of a long siege of attacks on Israel soldiers and civilians. In the same vein, Christopher urged Syrian President Hafez Assad in a 4 1/2-hour meeting in Damascus to make a public declaration denouncing murder of innocent civilians, a U.S. official said. Assad said he would consider it.

#### NATION Hill sentenced to death

PENSACOLA, Fia. — His usual bemused smile wiped off his face, Paul Hill listened with a bored look vesterday as a judge sentenced him to the electric chair for blowing out the brains of an abortion doctor and his bodyguard.

"May God have mercy on your soul," Circuit Judge Frank Bell intoned.

Moments later, an abortion foe shouted that Hill's blood would be on the hands of the judge, the jury and the people of Florida. Last month a jury unanimously recommended that the 40-year-old Hill be executed.

#### Report: Plutonium stored improperly

Report: Plutonium stored improperly
WASHINGTON — As much as 26 metric tons
of highly radioactive plutonium is being stored in
conditions that could endanger workers and
'potentially threaten the public and surrounding
environment," says an Energy Department report.
The review, which examined plutonium storage
at 35 government sites in more than a dozen states,
found plutonium in leaking and corroding packages, in cracking plastic bottles, in old decaying
buildings and in pipes, wentlation vents, equipment
and machinery. A department official cautioned
that the possibility of public exposure to plutonium
is extremely low and likely would occur only if a
storage facility were struck by a major catastrophe
such as an earthquake or tornado.

Student Activities Board Vice President Jason Martin said he found the portrayal of blacks in advertising interesting.

"It's something a lot of people don't address," Martin said. "We don't touch it in my advertising class, but we should because it is so batant."





# **Drop policy may be one cause**

One factor in the grade infla-tion debate deals with the mid-semester question — to withdraw or not to withdraw or not to withdraw? Robert Hemenway, chancellor for the Lexington Campus, said he thinks the current policy of allow-ing students to leave a class up to one week after the mid-term helps contribute to the inflation and makes the job of teaching more difficult.

ncult. The current policy has been in ice for a year. It was changed

last year by the University Senate to allow students to make a decision about a class after they had a chance to look at their mid-term scores. Before last year, the dead-line was set for the beginning of mid-term week, instead of the following Monday.

Hemenway, however, said this its too late and allows students to get out a class without struggling to improve their situation.

He said this also makes instructors hesitant, because they are often worried that students will drop their classes in the middle of the year.

During the fall 1994 semester, 431 students dropped their classes during the first nine weeks, including 226 who dropped them between weeks four and eight.

But Louis Swift, dean of Undergraduate Studies, said he thinks the time and money lost in retaking a class is punishment enough for dropping classes.

"Is the prospect that a student cannot drop out of a class ... enough motivation to prompt student to do well in a class?" Swift said. "In some cases, it certainly is, but it has never been persuasive to me."


