but you will be over on the show that I am putting out for Frank, and I am getting a bran new outfit I am spending between four and five thousand dollars for the outfit I was figuring on buying trucks as I have trucks on this show but if you already have truck i will pay you for using yours I will have short moves as my show is clean, would you want to move the whole outfit it would take four loads as I dont think it pays to overload a truck as I have five of them myself.

now I am depending on you coming over here this summer or as long as you want to stay as I never close only long enough to put the outfit away, in the fall and get it

out in the spring.

now I dont know whether Frank told you or not but you will have an orchestra to work with here.

and we will try and make it as pleasant as possible here as I have not always been a manager I worked on a salary for a long time.

I have been doing a nice business all winter, and every one satisfied, now I wasnt figuring on opening untill the 7th of may but you might not want to wait that long, if not i will put frank in a house or two untill such time as the weather permits to open under canvas, as we always have a few bad storms in the early spring, and if a man has got \$1600.00 in a tent alone it isnt found everyday and I dont want to stand any chance of it getting blowed away, and i opened up a week to soon last spring and i had my bran new outfit blowed down but it didnt happen to hurt it, as I had a special made tent, well will close for this time ans at once and let me know and if I can sure depend on you your monew here any time you want it here, and say boy if you are figuring on driving through if the roads is lik they are here you will have a h--- of a time, will close thanking you in advance for and early reply and for the offer I am awaiting your answer I am Yours Truly.

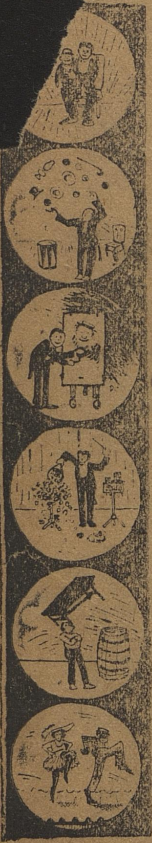
