The Clinging Vine

IN "The Clinging Vine," the outstanding musical success of last season in New York, Henry W. Savage, foremost of American theatrical producers, brought to lovers of comedy and music a very refreshing treat. The brilliance of comedy and beauty of music of "The Clinging Vine" exploded a pet theory of seasoned critics of the modern theatre, who lament that good librettos and sparkling tunes died with Gilbert & Sullivan.

The author of this scintillating story is Zelda Sears, probably the most brilliant of living librettists. She became famous overnight for her book and lyrics of "Lady Billy," in which the charming Mitzi played for three seasons. Miss Sears' new play for Mitzi, "The Magic Ring," and another musical comedy for the vivacious Miss Ada May Weeks, further distinguish this author's achievements.

The scenes of "The Clinging Vine" are laid at a smart country house, near New York, and much of the gayety naturally takes the form of singing and dancing. The charming musical score which perfectly fits the situations of the plot is by Harold Levey, Victor Herbert's young protege, whose "Lady Billy" music for Mitzi first made him famous. His song hits of "The Clinging Vine" have already been hummed and whistled from Coast to Coast.

Mr. Savage has provided "The Clinging Vine" with a practically flawless cast, every member of which has an established reputation on Broadway. The title role is sung by the lovely Miss Ferne Rogers, who endeared herself to audiences in the Southland during her recent appearances with DeWolf Hopper, in Gilbert & Sullivan revivals.

Because of the chummy intimacy of "The Clinging Vine," Mr. Savage has surpassed himself in perfecting each detail of the costuming, scenery, staging and orchestral effects.

"The Clinging Vine" is a radiant musical gem, sparkling both in words and music with real American humor and humanness, and vivid with the personalities of a perfect cast and chorus.
