



## Interviewing ...

## Your gateway to success

You may be qualified. Your grades may be great, but if you don't interview in an effective manner with perspective employers, somebody else may get that job.

Being able to project yourself during an interview isn't always easy, but with the proper frame of mind and preparation the interview will go a great deal smoother.

The foremost qualification is your attitude

Yep, that's right, attitude, the same thing your teachers at school and parents have talked to you about all these years. But it is true; attitude determines whether you get that job or not.

You may be dressed appropriately, have a very well-typed resume, and arrive on time, but if you give the impression you don't care about much more than how much money you make a year the only response you'll get is a letter saying "Thank you for interviewing with our company. I regret to inform you we will not be needing

Interviews look for keys on how the person feels about himself. If a student doesn't value his own selfworth, the interviewer will figure the student won't be worth much to his company. Does the student

look down the entire time he talks? Does he speak so softly the interviewer has trouble hearing him?

The one draw-back people have during interviews is nervousness. They realize the pressure is on to get the job and therefore do not react in a relaxed manner

This shows by fiddling with an ink pen, running words together or by an inability to concentrate on what the interviewer is saying.

One way to remedy this is practice

Practice on your roommates, friends and anyone who will listen. And if no one will listen, practice in front of the mirror. Chances are if

you have trouble communicating with your friends, you will have

trouble relating to someone who determines whether you will have a

It also is a good idea to interview with companies you are not particularly interested in at first, just to put you at ease.

Often people are fine when they know what to expect during an interview. We can always practice telling about our related experience and hobbies.

But it is not written anywhere that interviewers must be predicta-ble; he just may try to catch you off guard. He doesn't do it for sheer joy. It's his job to see how you handle the unexpected.

One question prospective employers ask may goes something like this: "Well Kathy, you've done a good job telling me what's good about you, but now tell me about what's bad about you.

This question could shock you worse than the first test you flunked when you were a freshman. But you can use it to your benefit if you can answer it in a way which sheds a positive light on vourself.

Talk about your tendency to be a workhorse. Tell how you often miss lunch just to get a job finished.

Comment on how you spend time reading professional journals and you just haven't been able to plant those flowers like you intended.

These are just suggestions, of course. Answer the question truth-fully in a way which reflect something that is negative, but don't ruin your chances of ever working

Review your resume before you go into the interview. If your resume mentiones you received William Danforth's "I Dare You" award in high school, be prepared for a question like this: "John, I see you received the Danforth award.

tell me one thing you learn from his book." It may appear you lack initiative if you have to tell the interviewer you did not read the book, or worse yet, that you didn't learn anything from the book. Be

Consider the interview opportunity, not a drudgery. Believe you are the best person for the job, and this is your chance to convince your premployer of the same.

## Placement Service offers aid to students

"Getting a job is no big thing. There are a lot of jobs available but is there a job available that's going to meet your personal requirements?" According to Harry Jones of the U.K. Placement Service, this can be the difference between "the job" and "a job".

Jones feels that students should "Interview, pursue jobs, answer ads, get as much information as possible about all facets of employment, then make their decision

One resource available to students is the Placement Service, located in the Mathews building Jones suggests that students should register the year they will be seeking employment. Forms and letters of explanation will be given to the student in a 'registration kit' One of the forms is for library

science majors, one for education

majors, and one general for all other majors. On this form a student should list all relevant courses, geographical preference,

From here the student will receive processed reference forms which he or she must give to those persons he or she listed to complete. Once the student has done this, Jones suggests that a current transcript be included with the references and basic data sheet to make up a student's credential file

At this point the student is ready to sign up for interviews. Jones

said the placement office puts out a bulletin the first, tenth, and twentieth of each month. These bulletins list job openings and qualifications which refer the student to a book where he selects a time for an interview.

Jones added that any student who signs up for an interview without proper qualifications for that particular job, will be marked off the list without notice. He explained this is done because of complaints from the recruiters in the past. However, if you have a particular interest in a job, you can write a letter to the company asking for written permission for an interview. This letter can then be shown to persons at the placement office and the exception will be

Probably the most important part in obtaining a job is the interview. An interviewer's first impression can secure or lose a person a

Several pamphlets, available from the UK Job Placement Cen-ter, second floor of the Matthews Building, provide excellent back-ground and hints for a would-be employee.

There are several steps one can take to prepare for an interview.

"Know where you want to go"and be specific as to what type of job appeals to you most. A job should be chosen because you want to do it 100 percent of the time, Placement Center Directer James

Alcorn said.

"Know all you can about the company." One should be familiar

with the company and its products. Be acquainted with the location of lants, offices and stores. One of the best ways to learn details of the inner workings of a company is to obtain a copy of their annual

When going for the interview, a student should realize the inter-viewer's basic purpose is to see what you are like, determine what you want, check your past qualifi-cations and to see what you may do for them in the future.

An interview is relatively short, so answers should be short enough to get the point across and precise enough to impress the interviewer.

One brochure states, "Don't be afraid to tell interviewers all about yourself. When they ask a question, don't just answer yes or no.

## Statistics projected for the 1980s

According to the New York Times Recruitment Survey, the 1980s sho uld yeild approximately 1.6 million jobs yearly. As a result of death, ret irement, or workers leaving their jobs, 3.9 million jobs will be created. These job openings will correspond closely with the est-imated number in the work force. each year.

The survey lists the growth rate for technicians in architecture is one of the highest at 52.2. Physical therapy has a sizable growth rate of Business administration majors can be encouraged with a predicted growth of 35.2, particu-

larly those planning to pursue careers in banking and finance, with a growth of 41.2 percent.

The projected growth rate for technicians in the fields of science and health professions are 25.9, and 331 respectively. The surpow and 33.1 respectively. The survey also sees the area of computer science as having a growth of 27.3, with job availability ranging from computer programing to computer

The survey indicated that while registered nurses will be needed more in inner cities, doctors and lawyers will be more in demand in suburbs.

Although jobs in home econom ics and education will be harder to find, teachers for the severely han-

dicapped are in great demand. This is due mainly to Public Law 94-142, which requires free public education for all students.

The New York Times Review reports that 80 percent of job openings aren't reported to agencies or advertised in newspapers. Geographically, the review says the Southwest Sunbelt area, (where population is increasing) will have the biggest amount of job open-ings. In areas with decreasing pop-ulation, the Northwest and Midwest, jobs will be scarce. The review reports that fields

such as promotion, advertising, travel, and landscape architecture are subject to change depending on economic situations

# Change in lifestyle, change in dress

So, you've landed your first fulltime job. You realize you are a part of the job market. With this change in lifestyle, you discover that you haven't a thing to wear!

Building a working wardrobe is often a problem and an unwelcome expense for many people. For the college graduate's new role in the work force suitable clothing is needed, something other than jeans and casual wear. The person back in the job market may also discover that much of her clothing is inappropriate for work.

"The appropriate outfit for any activity helps you to look capable, as well as feel better about the task," says Jo Ann Hilliker. She is the Cooperative Extension Service specialist in clothing.

When you look good you feel more confident and other people respond to you favorably. Employers want people to present a good image for their company. Studies show that an attractive appearance does make a difference in hiring and promotion. Thus, a good appearance can be an economic advantage.

Start by assessing your present wardrobe. The specialist suggests that you begin by sorting clothing into three categories: throw aways, give aways, and items on which to build. Put aside clothing that is inappropriate, such as 'dressy' outfits, flashy fabrics, extreme styles, glittery and jangly jewelry, jeans, too tight or too short garments and revealing necklines.

"Conservative, rather than dramatic styles, generally create a more favorable impression with employers," Hilliker said. "High styles or revealing garments often look ridiculous in the business setting, where attention-getting clothes usually make the employer question the wearer's seriousness about her job."

Adding to your present wardrobe requires a plan. Determine the minimum basic garments needed for your life style, then design a plan to build around a few basic garments.

For example, these may include dresses, blouses, skirts, pants, sleepwear, lingerie and accessories. Decide which of these you already have and what you will need to purchase.

"Include some basic separates

that can be combined in a variety of ways to give you many different outfits. A good start would be a jacket, skirt, a pair of pants and a blouse that will all mix and match," Hilliker suggested.

You may want to consider the life expectacy of a garment to help you determine how much you want to invest. For example, you may want to buy the best you can afford in basic garments, such as coats and suits, that will be worn through several seasons. However, you may not want to spend much

money on fun garments that may be the latest this season, but gone the next

"A good plan also builds around a few key colors that you are comfortable with," said Hilliker. "One or two basic colors make mixing and matching a simple task. Also, basic colors eliminate the need for purses and shoes to go with only one or two outfits."

Remember that with a little planning you can create a working wardrobe that will really work for

## Col. James Alcorn offers advice for interviews, information with Placement Service

In a time when jobs are hard to locate, UK's Placement Center offers students access to potential employers.

According to Col. James Alcorn, director of UK's job placement center, "Our purpose is to provide assistance in determining where (students) want to go and what they want to do. "We call it career planning," he said.

Col. Alcorn added that the cen-"can identify that 40 percent of the people who register with us have jobs. I think it's higher than that but I can't prove it because the only way (the placement service) can find out is by the students tell-

Two functions are provided by the center, the Director said. First, a listing of career and part-

time job opportunities for fresh-men, sophomores and juniors is available. Second, company representatives are brought to campus in order to meet and talk with interested in specific companies.

When a senior first comes to the center, a data sheet is completed. Col. Alcorn said the data sheet is used "to acquaint the recruiter with the student's qualifications.'

At this time, the student will be able to pick up information giving tips on preparing a resume and going for an interview.

The data sheet is filed with any recommendations the student may have from past employers, and a copy of the student's transcript, the

If a company calls and specifies an interest in students majoring in a certain area, the center searches the files and sends data sheet(s) to the employer, Col. Alcorn said. The employer will then contact the student directly, he added.

However, if the recruiter comes to campus, the student can sign up for an interview, he said. The data sheet will then be given to the recruiter for the interview

During the interview "the student must convince the employer (he or she) is the best person for the job, or else (they) won't get it,"Col.

"If I were a student," he said, "I would carry a copy of the transcript (and resume) with me." This shows prior planning and shows the student has initiative," Col. Alcorn added.

You (the student) are making it easier for the interviewer to say yes, you're the one we want to 'he said.

He continued, "Most of us don't think about what is going to be asked in an interview."

"Some applicants create an impression of indifference by acting too casual, while others seem to in the last stages of nervous fright, and can only respond to questions in terrified monosyllables," according to a pamphlet distributed by the placement center.

On September 15, three pamphlets were distributed naming the company and times an interviewer will be on campus.

"Normally these sheets (which can be picked up at the placement center) will come out a month before an interview date, the Direc-

Following September the sheets will be available on the first, tenth and twentieth of each month, Col.

Once a semester, UK's placement center sponsors a Career Day. These are designed to get general information about a company distributed to the students.

This semester, Career Day will be Oct. 15 at the Student Center.

"Right now there are 27 companies signed up to attend," Col. Alcorn said. "We're hoping to get 50 to 60 companies there.

When determining the proper career field to pursue, the student should first determine what they like to do, Col. Alcorn said. Each person must identify the skills they like and dislike, he said

A person should "try to get where you can use the skills you enjoy using 100 percent of the time," Col. Alcorn added.

He said how leisure time is spent should also be a factor. One would not want to be located in Alaska if he enjoys waterskiing.

According to Col. Alcorn, the most asked for fields, with the exception of health related majors,

## Playing the horses offers alternative to working world

The crisp air of autump evokes thoughts of burgoo, high-brimmed hats laden with flowers, binoculars, and...horses.

Instead of spending the day studying, why not visit Keeneland and make a brief career of 'playing the horses?'The following sugges-tions are given to clarify the Racing Form-if not to make you a big winner

The Daily Racing Form is the most useful tool in judging a horse's potential performance in a race. The information is coded in abstract manner which is explained below

The top section of the Daily Racing Form tells the name of the horse, his color, gender, year foaled(born) his sire(father), dam(mother), and

To the far left of the newspaper page chart is the last date a horse raced. Some horses can withstand

a race one week after having just raced—and in fact some thrive on the competition; but the average horse does not run more frequently than every other week.

nas run. Perhaps he has placed(run first, second, or third) in a one and one—eighth mile race and his performance today will be a six furlong(three—fourths mile) race.

If a horse has not run for six months or more, one can assume that he has probably been laid up because of injury. Most bettors will avoid a horse just "coming back" unless they have inside information that he has returned to form.

Look at the condition of the animals in the paddock prior to the race. This is never completely reliable but the horse who is carrying excess weight, sweating profusely (washy), or has a dull look to his eyes or coat; usually needs more conditioning, experience, or rest.

race. If he was near the front in the race and steadily dropped back, he might be sprinting material preferring the short distances. Contrarily, if he was near the back

of the pack and gradually improved his position, he would appear to be more of a stayer. One would not rate him as having much chance today

Jones also suggests that if you have certain qualifications that aren't listed on the basic data sheet, you should write a resume and take to the interviewer prior to the interview. He stressed that this isn't a hiring interview, but rather a screening interview.

If the student is then invited for a second interview, Jones said this is usally the hiring interview. He added that this is usally conducted by the person(s) the student would be working for, if he chooses to accept the job.

"We're here to assist students in getting a job," Jones said. "Our job is to get recruiters in here." The placement service also offers students information about law schools, internships, and the national teacher's examination.

Jones said that "Not knowing what the company (that you are being interviewed by) is about just kills them." Which is one reason the placement service has alibrary where students can research the different companies to find out basic information about them.

The placement service also offers students a chance to participate in "mock interviews." Came ras and tapes are used and played back to the student, who is critiqued Jones said this is so "the student will be a more polished performer.

These services aren't limited to students. Alumni can register as an unperson. This means they are unemployed, underemployed, or unhappy in their present job. The office will then reactivate their file and send them a bulletin every two weeks.

"Jobs come in many forms," said Jones, "We're one. Your specific college or department has many contacts. You as an individual need to utilize all the resources available to you here on campus, in your hometown and all to select the best job for you

According to the placement center's annual report, last year 511 organizations visited campus, and conducted 6,700 interviews. There were another 2,795 students signed up on overflow. Overflow is v the interviews are all booked but the company will at least receive the overflows' data sheet, and possibly be invited for an interview.

In some cases a company will phone in or write a letter specifying qualifications for certain job open ings. The placement service will then look through the registers and send the company a list of students that meet these requirements. From there the company will contact the students. Last year 15,000 vacancies were reported to the placement office by telephone letter, and 3,309 sets of credentials were sent to employers.

### RESUMES

A resume is a way to introduce yourself to an employer. It allows an interviewer immediate access to the important parts of your life.

What to include:

At the top of the resume, one should include their name, address and telephone. This allows the interviewer to return letters and other correspondance a bit quicker and shows interest in hearing from that company.

Experience. Beginning with a "Take the opportunity to tell student's most recent job, list them your goals and strong employer, position held, date of points." employment and length of

 Education. Again begin with the most recent educational experience. Don't indicate grades or averages unless you were portion of your class. Highlight memberships in honor groups, or professional societies.

References. There is no need to list references on the form directly. A statement indicating that references will be available upon request should be sufficient.

The reader will also note many horses have numbers listed here. This is the purchase price for which one may claim a horse. The prices vary from \$1,250 at the county fair tracks to \$75,000 at the major

tracks.
If a small "c" is in front of the figure, the animal was claimed for that amount

Observe the difference in the claiming price from the last time the horse ran. If he ran for a \$15,000 tag, and is now entered for \$10,000. the trainer is probably anxious for him to improve his performance by running against horses of lesser quality, or he is hoping to have him claimed because of soundness problems

The next figure is the speed rating of the horse. A rating of 100 means that the horse's time equaled the track record.

If you are comparing the speed ratings, keep in mind that different tracks have different surfaces and some are known for producing faster times. The tracks in California are known to be harder and faster while those in the East are generally deeper and sometimes slower.

The winner of the race mentioned and the horse that placed are both listed with the weight the winner carried. If a small "f" is in front of the winner's name, it was a race for fillies only.

Last in the column is the number

of horses who have run.
