

U.S. Supreme Court approves some mandatory drug testing

WASHINGTON — The Supreme Court, establishing guidelines to test for drug and alcohol abuse in the American workplace, approved mandator, leads yesterday yes restricted with public safety.

The justices, voling 7-2, upheld federal regulations forcing railroad workers involved in accidents to undergo blood and urine tests. By a separate 5-4 vote, the

to require tests for workers in sensitive jobs.

Bush administration officials hailed the rulings. Union officials who had challenged the mandatory tests said they were disappointed but some expressed hope the impact would be limited.

Justice Anthony M. Kennedy, writing for the court in both cases, said such tests do not violate workers' privacy rights even though they may be conducted without a court warrant or a suspicion that an individual is using drugs or alcohol.

While the rulings do not directly affect most private employment, they likely will encourage private employers who impose such tests.

If anything, there is less protection for workers in private jobs because the Constitution's privacy guarantees generally restrict only actions by government officials. Yesterday's rulings directly affect other drug and alcohol testing programs conducted by federal, state and local governments. For example, they could be used to support testing of police and firefighters.

Regardless of how much or how little you like Depeche Mode's music, you can still appreciate their live show.

The "No. 1 coaching job in America" is now open. Since Eddie Sutton resigned Sunday night, hundreds of aspiring basketball coaches around the nation must be chomping at the bit to step into the limelight of coaching the Wildcats.

C.M. Newton, who is scheduled to take over as athletics director April 1, said he plans to begin an extensive search to replace Sutton.

When I do make an attempt at reading the material, it is so boring that my mind starts to wander and I don't remember anything I've read. Do you have any suggestions? Uneasy Reader.

Dear Uneasy: The experiences you are having with reading text-books is one of the most common study problems faced by students. Students of studying involves reading, it is clear that effective reading is a skill that is fundamental for success in college. However, the skill of reading the textbook assignment in a reasonable amount of time with an acceptable level of comprehension is the student of the student of the control of the students. We generally have no problem with comprehension or rate when reading an interesting article in our favorite celebrity in People magazine. Usually, we first look at all the pictures and eapliens and then quickly skim through the arti-

cle seeking information that is new and interesting about the celebrity. Has it occurred to you to apply this same strategy to reading a textbook? Of course, textbook read-ing is more demanding, but using getive reading strategies will help you achieve the level of concentra-tion required for good comprehen-sion.

sion.

The most effective method for reading textbooks is the SQ3R study reading strategy. The steps in the strategy are survey, question, read, recite and review.

Survey: Glance over the head-ings in the chapter to see the few big points which will be developed. This survey should not take more than a minute and will show the three to six core ideas around which the rest of the discussion will cluster.

which the rest of the discussion will cluster.

If the chapter has a final sum-mary paragraph this will also list the ideas developed in the chapter. This orientation will help you orga-nize the ideas as you read them later.

V Question: Now begin to work. Turn the first heading into a question. This will arouse your curiosity and increase comprehension. It will bring to mind information al-ready known, thus helping you to understand that section more witch!

planatory detail is recognized as such. This turning a heading into a question can be done on the instant of reading, the heading, but it de-mands a conscious effort on the part of the reader to make this query for which he must read to find the answer.

Read: Read to answer that question, i.e., to the end of the first headed section. This is not a pas-sive plowing along each line, but an active search for the answer.

A Recite: Having read the first section, look away from the book and try briefly to recite the answer words and mame an example. If you can do this, you know what is in the book if you can't need to the section again. An excelent way to do this reciting from memory is to jot down cue phrases in outline form on a sheet of paper. Make these notes very brief!

Now repeat steps 2, 3, and 4 on each succeeding headed section. That is, turn the next heading into a question. Read to answer that question, and recite the answer by joiling down cue phrases in your outline. Read in this way until the entire lesson is completed.

➤ Review: When the lesson has been read through, look over your notes to get a bird's eye view of the points and of their relationships and check your memory as to the content by reciting on the major details under each heading. This checking of memory can be done by covering up the notes and
