know there is often something



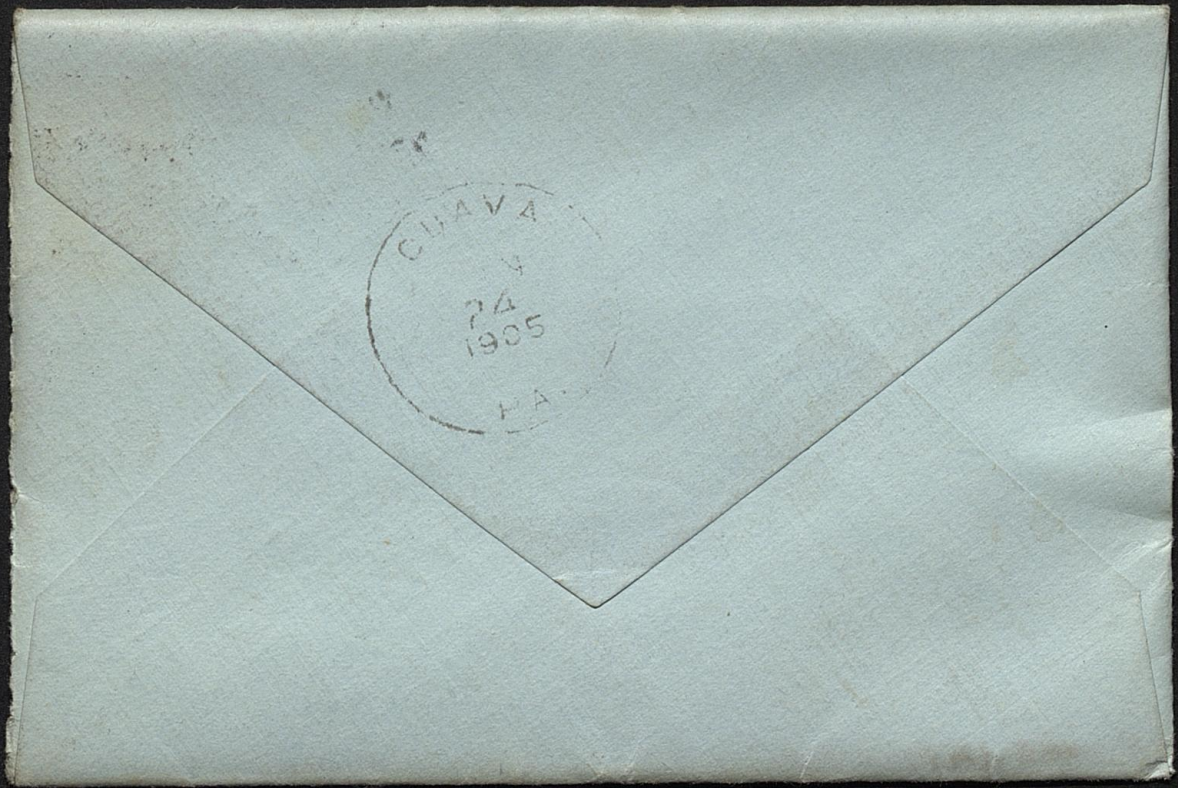
happen but I think every
