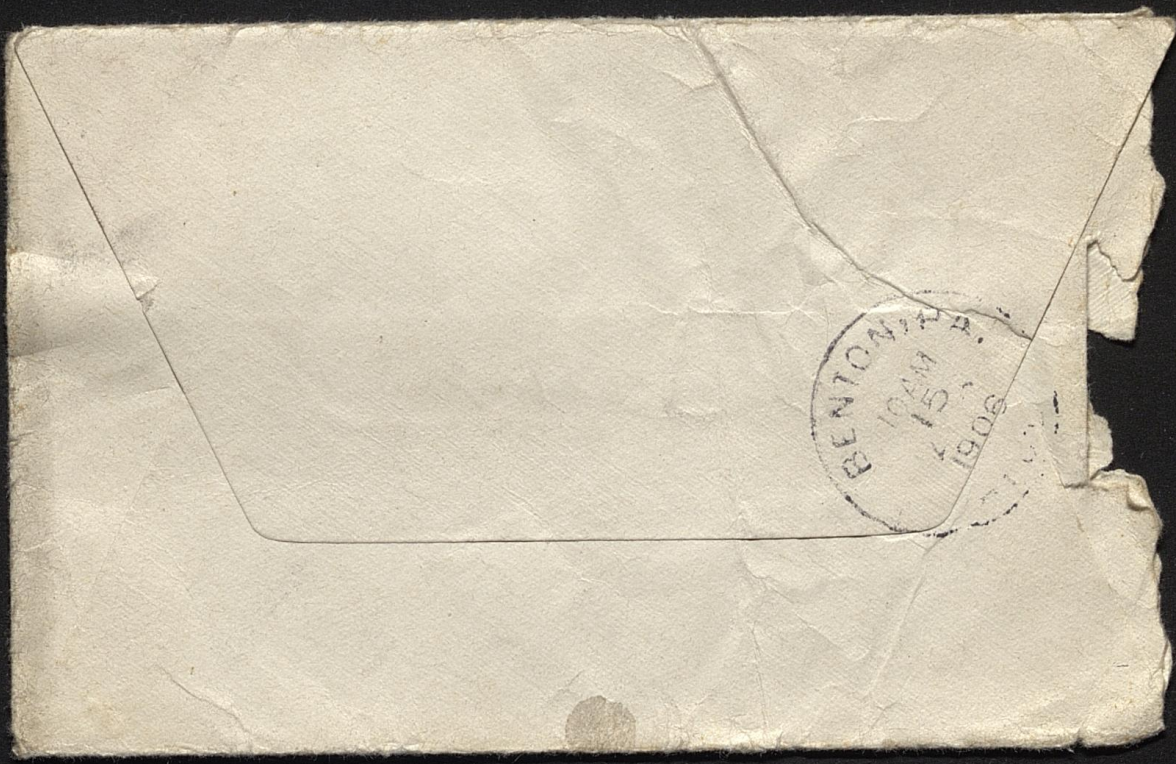

My Dearest little sweetheart

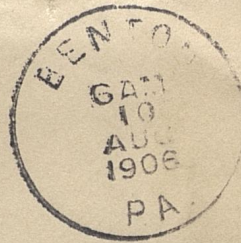
