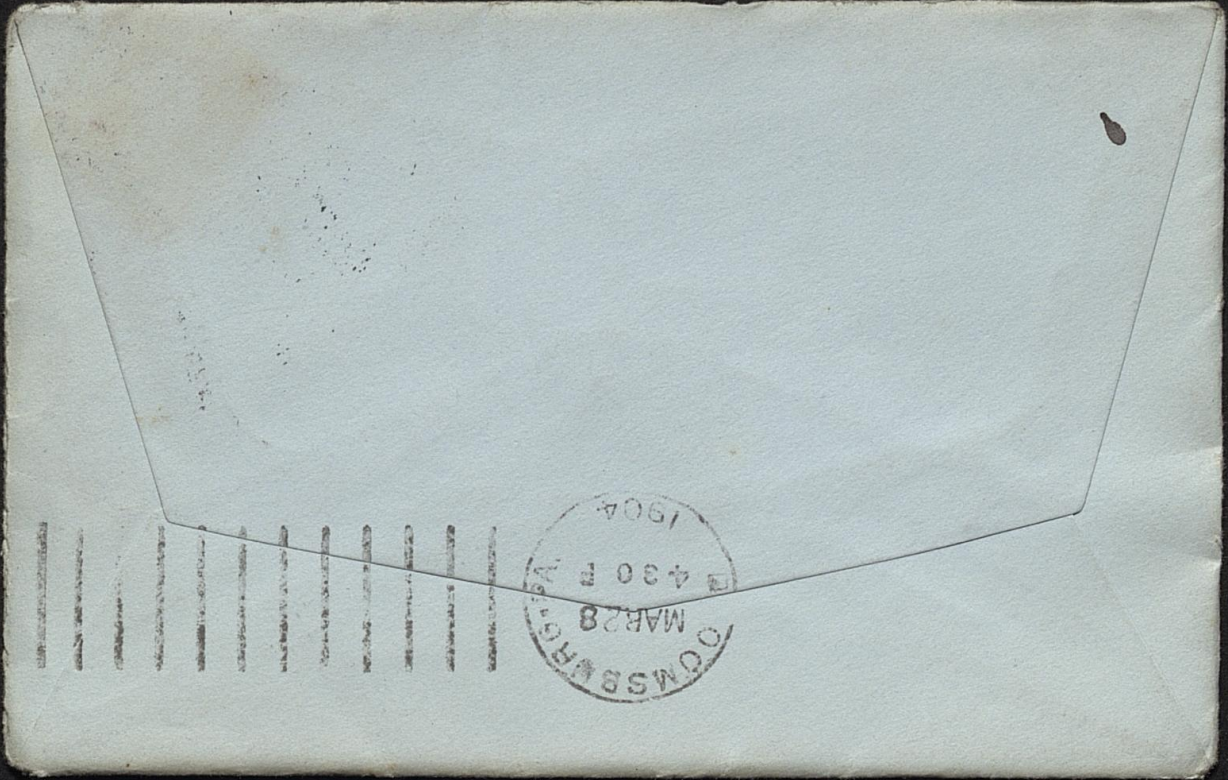

we all miss him very much

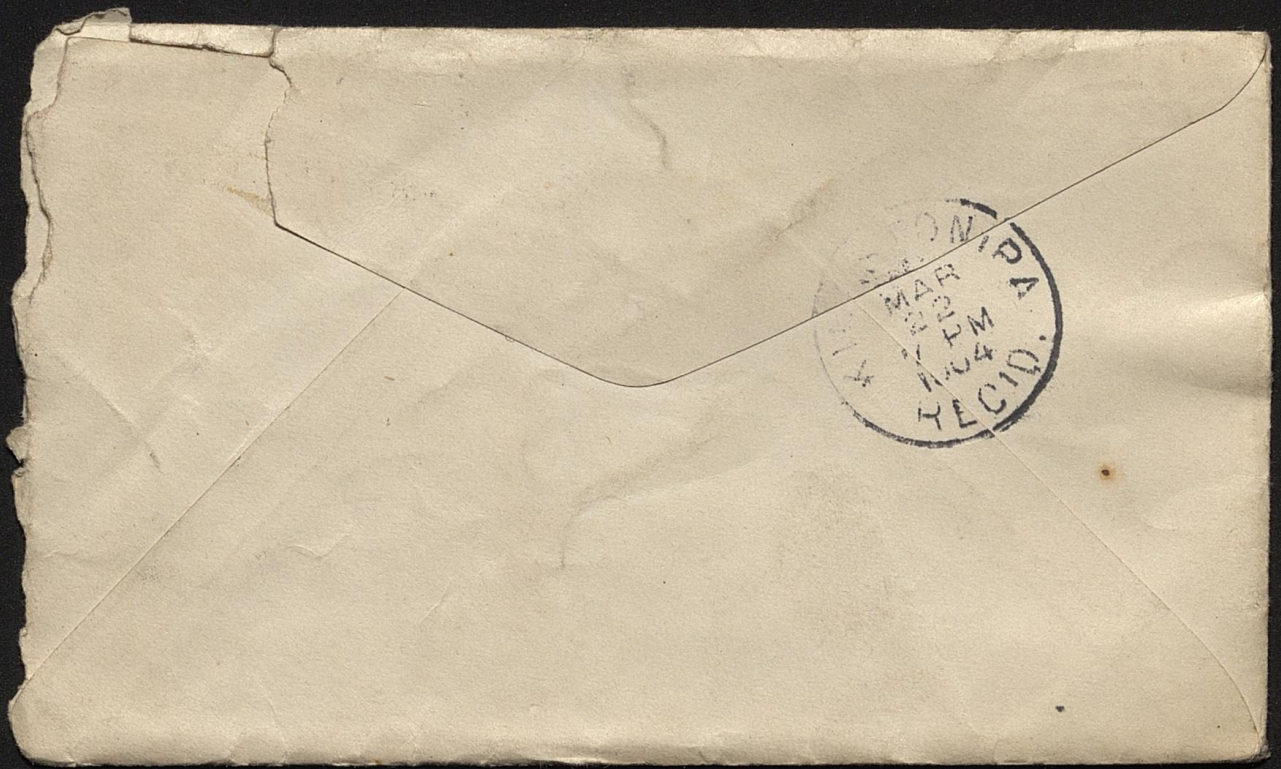
Flossie was down to Benton

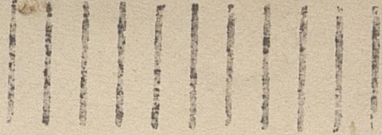

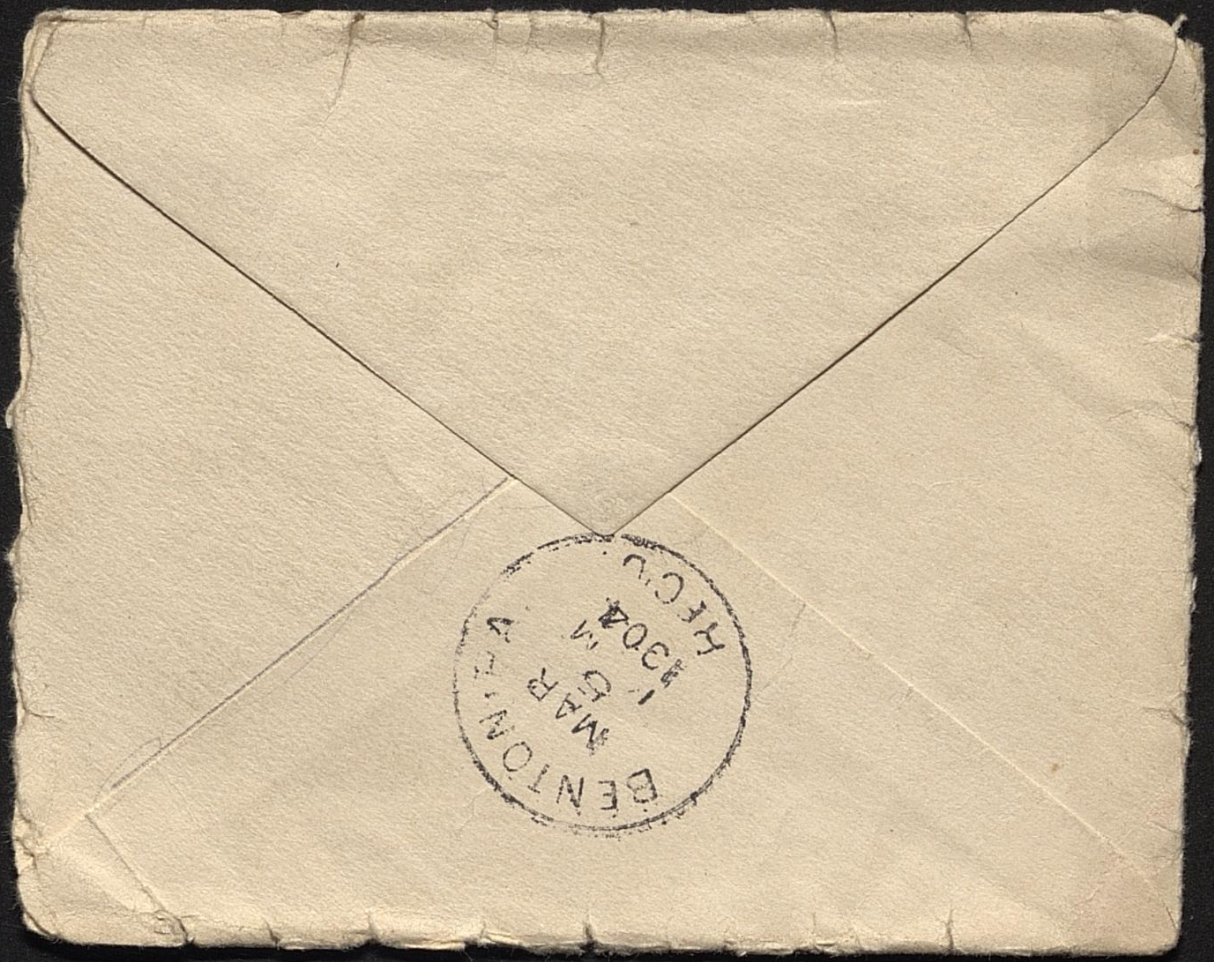
